CAUSEWAY 5K RAISES OVER 40K TO FIGHT HUNGER

On October 10th we held our 4th Annual Causeway 5K at Southern Regional High School in Manahawkin. In comparison to last year's 5K, we had a 50% increase in runners/walkers and 17 new sponsors!

We were able to raise an astonishing \$20,125 for Fulfill! (Formerly known as The Foodbank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties). Causeway President, Dave Wintrade, kindly matched that amount bringing the grand total to \$40,250! Every dollar donated to Fulfill provides three meals to those in need. This means we were able to provide our neighbors with 120,750 meals! This really put a dent in addressing the food insecurity issue right here in our community!

Our very first Causeway 5K was held back in October of 2018, which raised \$3,000. Dave Wintrade kindly matched that amount bringing the grand total to \$6,000 for Fulfill. We all had a great time running and raising money for our friends at Fulfill that we decided to host our Second Annual Causeway 5K in October

of 2019. We had set a goal to beat the funds raised in 2018 and did just that! We were able to raise \$5,743.50 and once again, Dave Wintrade kindly matched that amount, bringing the grand total to \$11,487! Last October we held our 3rd Annual Causeway 5K and raised \$13,670 and Dave Wintrade once again matched that, bringing the total to \$27,340!

TRAVIS MANION 9/11 HEROES RUN 5K

Since 2008, the races, organized by the Travis Manion Foundation (TMF) each September, have honored the nearly 3,000 lives lost on 9/11. Also, the race benefits veterans, military and first responders who continue to serve the U.S. and communities to this day.

On Saturday, September 11, 2021, exactly 20 years after the 9/11 attacks on our country, the Southern Regional HS wrestling program, in coordination with the Stafford Township Police Department and local community sponsors, conducted a TMF 9/11 Heroes 5K Run in downtown Manahawkin.

The races were inspired by the death of 1st Lt. Travis Manion, who was killed by an enemy sniper in Iraq in April 2007 when he was pulling his wounded teammates to safety. Before his final tour in Iraq, Travis Manion visited the New York City Fire Department Rescue Company 1, which lost almost all of its men on 9/11. When he came back from his visit, his sister, Ryan Manion recalled Travis saying, "This is why we're here today. This is why we're fighting in Afghanistan." The phrase "If Not Me.. Then Who.." became the trademark of the Travis Manion Foundation.

The 2021 race drew around 60 runners this year. Runners consisted of Southern Regional Wrestlers and members

from the Stafford PD. There is a strong interest to grow the annual 9/11 Heroes Run hosted in Manahawkin, NJ. The leadership and volunteerism displayed by Dan Roy (Southern Regional Wrestling Head Coach) and Joe Stanziano (Stafford PD Patrolman) to ensure that the race was a success is consistent with the spirit of the phrase "If Not Me. Then Who." We hope to see more of you in the Southern Ocean County community participating with us next year!

OCEAN COUNTY COLLEGE WELCOMES WORLD-RENOWNED PRESIDENTIAL HISTORIAN AND PULITZER PRIZE-WINNING AUTHOR DORIS KEARNS GOODWIN

The Blauvelt Speaker Series welcomed Doris Kearns Goodwin to the main stage at the Jay and Linda Grunin Center for the Arts on Wednesday, October 6th to discuss "No Ordinary Time: Three Leaders who shaped the American Century: Theodore Roosevelt, Franklin Roosevelt and Eleanor Roosevelt."

Though seating was limited due to the Global Health Crisis, all available seats were sold out and the event was also offered virtually for all who registered to view the event remotely.

The conversation was moderated by Prof. Stephen Downey, Lecturer of History at Ocean County College and offered an opportunity for questions and answers from the audience.

Doris Kearns Goodwin's career as a presidential historian and author was inspired when, as a 24-year-old graduate student at Harvard University, she was selected to join the White House Fellows, one of America's most prestigious programs for leadership and public service. Goodwin worked with President Lyndon Baines Johnson in the White House and later assisted him in writing his memoirs.

Goodwin was awarded the Pulitzer Prize for "No Ordinary Time: Franklin and Eleanor Roosevelt: The Home Front in World War II", and her sixth book, "The Bully Pulpit: Theodore Roosevelt, William Howard Taft, and the Golden Age of Journalism."

Her book, "Team of Rivals: The Political Genius of Abraham Lincoln" served as the basis for Steven Spielberg's hit film "Lincoln" and, was awarded the prestigious Lincoln Prize, the inaugural Book Prize for American History and the Lincoln Leadership Prize.

Recently, her seventh book, "Leadership in Turbulent Times", was published in September 2018, to critical acclaim, and became an instant New York Times bestseller.

"This series provides for a wonderful opportunity to bring subject experts, entertainers and thought leaders directly to the students of Ocean County and our broader community," said Kenneth



J. Malagiere, Executive Director of the OCC Foundation. "We are so very fortunate to have an engaged faculty, often called upon to moderate and guide our conversations, even when we took the series fully virtual last year."

"We are so pleased to be back in person while continuing to offer all of our future discussions virtually to broaden our audience and share the valuable perspectives of our guests with our entire community and beyond," added Malagiere.

The Blauvelt Speaker Series began in late 2017 and has welcomed thought leaders, artists and performers to Ocean County College to provide educational enrichment, community conversation and intellectual opportunities for learners of all ages. Past guests include Erin Brockovich, Arthur C. Brooks, Misty Copeland, Thomas Friedman, Dr. Temple Grandin, David Ignatius, Secretary Jeh Johnson, Jon Meacham, Chrissy Metz, Anna Deavere Smith, and Alton Fitzgerald White and the National Geographic renowned NatGeo Live Series.

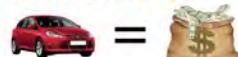

OLDER NJ RESIDENTS SAY MEDICARE SHOULD BARGAIN WITH DRUG MAKERS

Large majorities of New Jerseyans age 50 and older say Medicare should be able to negotiate with drugmakers to get lower prices for prescription medications, according to a new Fairleigh Dickinson University Poll done in partnership with AARP.

The issue is currently a key one before Congress as Democrats try to reach an elusive agreement on what programs and provisions to include in the social-program budget reconciliation bill. The potential Medicare savings are seen as one way to offset the cost of the spending.

The opinion is shared across party lines, with 92% of Democrats and 85% of Republicans saying that Medicare should be allowed to negotiate drug prices. Ninety-eight percent of Democrats and 85% of Republicans say it is very or somewhat important to act on prescription costs this year.

"This is what's really interesting to me is the fact that there is nothing in modern American politics that 90% of any group agrees on," said Dan Cassino, executive director of the FDU Poll and a professor of government and politics. "Twenty percent of Americans think that 9/11 was faked, so if you can get 90% of people to agree on anything, that's pretty notable."

The Kaiser Family Foundation says that in 2019, Medicare Part D covered more than 3,500 prescription drug products with total spending of \$183 billion, not including rebates.

Medicare cannot negotiate with drug companies to get better prices, as other countries and private insurers do.

"It's outrageous that we're paying three times more in other countries for the same drugs," said Stephanie



Hunsinger, AARP New Jersey state director. "No one should have to choose between buying medicine or paying for their food or rent."

"Our New Jersey representatives have a chance to make real change by allowing Medicare to negotiate for lower drug prices," Hunsinger said. "Pharma is getting rich and we are getting ripped off. Enough is enough."

Eighty-three percent of voters 50 and older say they've been prescribed medication in the past two years, and a quarter say they've decided not to fill at least one prescription. Cassino said there are sometimes personal and medical reasons for that but that cost was one of the most commonly cited reasons for skipping a prescription.

"Most of the people we're talking to are on Medicare, so they have government-provided health insurance that's

supposed to be covering their prescriptions," Cassino said. "But still we find a quarter of people over 50 say they have skipped a medication the last couple years."

Two-thirds of residents 50 and older say they're very or somewhat concerned about being able to afford medications in the future.

Cassino said the poll results show people think negotiating drug prices is "a common-sense idea" and that moderate Democrats on the fence about the topic might want to take heed.

"This is across the state, North Jersey, South Jersey," he said. "If 90% of my constituents think this is a good idea, it might be a good idea perhaps to give them what they want."

HOW TO PROTECT YOURSELF AND YOUR MOBILE PHONE FROM SIM SWAP SCAMS

Don't let your smartphone, its data, and passwords get hijacked by thieves

internet, can make the bogus ploy sound convincing.

Once your SIM has been hijacked, calls, texts and other data that are supposed to go to you are diverted to the imposter's device. This may include texts with the one-time-use multi-factor authentication code that is supposed to provide you with an extra layer of security beyond a passcode. Instead, it may unlock the door for a thief to change or access your email addresses, social media profiles, financial records and bank accounts.

'You lose complete access to your phone'

"SIM swapping is a real threat," says Eva Velasquez, president and CEO of the San Diego-based Identity Theft Resource Center, which educates consumers on the risks of identify theft and offers free resources to help victims recover. "It is a tactic that can be used to commit identity theft, and the effects can be very damaging. You will know if your SIM has been swapped if you lose complete access to your phone."

In a study published in early 2020, researchers at Princeton University explained how they tested the authentication mechanisms in place for legitimate SIM swaps at AT&T, T-Mobile, Tracfone, US Mobile and Verizon Wireless. They signed up for 50 prepaid accounts, 10 with each carrier, and subsequently called in to request a SIM swap on each account. Their key finding: All five carriers used insecure authentication challenges that attackers could easily subvert.

Carriers are bolstering internal processes to combat this criminal activity, according to the CTIA, a wireless industry trade group that changed its name from the Cellular Telecommunications Industry Association in 2004. That includes the ability to lock or freeze your account, working with law enforcement, and training employees to look out for the fraud.

Some carriers allow only in-store changes

In some instances, a company may restrict customer accounts so changes can only be made in the store with a government-issued ID, says Kevin Lee, who is pursuing a doctorate in computer science and is co-author of the Princeton report.

T-Mobile says its account holders must choose a 6-to-15-digit PIN, and that a customer's phone number cannot be ported without verification of that PIN. T-Mobile also offers what it calls Account Takeover Protection, which adds additional security to accounts by blocking unauthorized users from transferring your lines to another wireless carrier. AT&T similarly lets you create a unique passcode you'll have to provide before account changes can be made, including port requests initiated by another carrier.

Cash App, which is owned by Square Inc. and not a bank, recently unleashed an artificial intelligence-driven feature that it says flags potential spam or scams for payments in the app.

But you can take steps as a smart consumer to minimize the risk. Here's what experts suggest.

Don't give out personal info

- Don't reply to calls, emails or texts that request personal information. If you get such a request for account or personal information, contact the company directly on your own, using a phone number or website you know to be genuine.

- Use multi-factor authentication. As previously noted, two-factor authentication, 2FA for short, will be useless if the code to verify your identity arrives on the crook's phone and he already knows your passcode.

But "a knee-jerk reaction may be to turn off 2FA altogether, and that is actually even more dangerous," Lee says. Enabling this extra layer of security "only adds to the username and password requirements, potentially making it tougher for attackers to hijack. At the end of the day, it's still better than nothing."

David Strom of the Avast digital security firm is among the experts who recommends switching your second authentication factor from SMS texting to an authenticator app such as Authy or Google Authenticator. He also points to Zenkey, a mobile app available in the Google Play Store and Apple App Store, resulting from a collaboration among AT&T, T-Mobile and Verizon. You'll need to get the Zenkey version tied to your specific mobile provider.

Protect your phone and SIM

- Protect the physical device. That means using the facial recognition or fingerprint scanning options common in smartphones today, Velasquez says, along with a PIN.

- Protect the physical SIM. You can lock your SIM with a numerical PIN you would have to enter every time you restart a device or remove a SIM. You can create such a PIN inside the settings on your iPhone or Android device.

- Be careful what you post online. This generally means avoiding the kind of information often prompted by security questions, including birthdates, the name of your pet, your best friend's first name and high school mascot.

- Keep your email inbox clean. Wipe out the messages that don't need to be there, including any with passcodes, PINs, Social Security numbers, and billing statements that may reveal some or all of these details if your device is ever hacked.

Share landline, not mobile number

- Don't overshare your mobile number. AT&T recommends using your landline when sharing a number with a dry cleaner, grocery store or other businesses. Unless you have business reasons to do otherwise, don't include your number on social media or as part of your email signature.

You also can get a free phone number to give to businesses or acquaintances that you don't want to have access to your real number, and it will ring on your phone. This "burner" number is something that can protect your privacy and is easily disposable if you want a different one later.

- Report suspicious activity. If you notice something unusual, contact your mobile provider, bank and credit card company right away, and make certain your account credentials haven't been changed. You may want to file an identity theft report with the Federal Trade Commission.

In its letter to Thomas acknowledging that her phone had been compromised, T-Mobile offered other sound advice: Consider placing a fraud alert with any of the three major credit bureaus — Equifax, Experian or TransUnion — which signals creditors to get in touch with you before opening a new account in your name.



BACKUP GENERATORS CAN GIVE YOUR HOUSE SOME JUICE

AS SEVERE WEATHER CREATES OUTAGES, ALTERNATIVE POWER PROVIDERS ARE THE HOT NEW HOME ACCESSORY

System Size and Cost

Kenny Marshall lives in the suburbs of Los Angeles, where 100-plus-degree summer days have at times brought on rolling blackouts. As people crank their AC, power lines can overheat from the added demand for electricity and must be shut down temporarily to prevent catastrophic fires. "Last year we were without power for three days in 117-degree heat," Marshall says. "You cannot survive here without air-conditioning."

This February, in Austin, Texas, Joe Rizzo experienced a polar opposite (pun intended) problem: Unusually frigid weather led to power outages for 3 million Texans. "We had elderly people stuck in their homes for up to a week, with indoor temperatures below freezing," he says.

Marshall and Rizzo are in the generator business (they're the owners of All American Generators and Capital Power Systems, respectively). It's a booming industry across the country as homeowners seek a way to keep the power on in an era of unprecedented weather-related outages. One major producer, Generac, reported that sales of residential generators nearly doubled in the first half of 2021, compared with the same period in 2020. Generators will keep your home running when the power grid can't, but they can be a major investment. Here are a few pro tips.

How They Work

Standby generators connect to the utility grid through a switch that kicks on when the grid goes down — "within 10 seconds," Marshall says — and use the home's gas supply (whether propane or natural gas) to fuel the generator and create electricity. Generators are typically housed in a metal box in the yard, with underground connections to the gas and electrical lines that must be installed by licensed professionals. Permits from local authorities are typically required.

Where to Put One

Household generators resemble a large ice chest. They're typically bolted to a concrete pad, Rizzo says. The closer they are to electrical and gas supply lines, the cheaper the installation is. Generators are essentially a small engine, which means they make noise. "They're not that loud, but you might not want it next to your bedroom window," he adds.

The cost of standby generators depends on the size of the home and its power requirements, says Rizzo, though they typically cost \$10,000 to \$13,000 (including installation) for a home up to 3,000 square feet. Homeowners may be tempted to cut costs with a portable generator powered by gasoline or diesel; these can be purchased from home improvement stores for less than \$1,000 and do not require professional installation. But they have significant drawbacks. While portable generators are not designed to be stored outdoors, they must be operated outside. So you'll need to haul it out to a rain-protected location each time it's needed, says Rizzo, who notes that people are often tempted to run them in their garage, where they create a carbon monoxide risk. "They're dangerous," he says. Plus, they won't power your whole home, only what can be plugged into an extension cord (lamps, computers, phones, space heaters, a single refrigerator).

Worth the Expense?

If you are hoping to make your money back on a whole-home backup generator when you sell your house, don't count on it. The equipment will increase the value of your home, but on average by only a little over 50 percent of the cost of the generator, according to a 2017 study published by Remodeling, a trade magazine.

But there's more than return on investment to consider. The Department of Energy doesn't track every power outage in America — only those deemed "electric disturbance events." The criteria for those varies, depending on whether the cause is, say, a natural disaster, a cyberattack or a lack of supply to meet demand. From the early 2000s to 2020, the number of such events increased nearly 12-fold. These are more than an inconvenience; hundreds of deaths were attributed to the loss of power in Texas this winter. Marshall says assisted living facilities and homeowners aging in place are among his top clients. CPAP machines, electric adjustable beds, medications that require refrigeration — there's a long list of reasons that standby generators are not just a luxury, but essential. "My clients can't afford to have the power go out," he says.

YEARLY MAMMOGRAMS ARE THE KEY TO EARLY BREAST CANCER DETECTION

Health experts encourage women to keep up with their yearly mammograms to ensure early detection and the best treatment possible.

According to The American Cancer Society, about 8,330 people in New Jersey will be diagnosed this year with breast cancer. For the first time ever, female breast cancer has surpassed lung cancer as the most commonly diagnosed cancer worldwide.

But the good news is that the breast cancer death rate has dropped by 41% from 1989 to 2018, said Dr. Adriana Suarez-Ligon, breast cancer oncologist at Rutgers Cancer Institute of New Jersey.

“The reason why we’ve seen this death rate from breast cancer drop is solely because of early detection through mammographic screening. Of course, there have been many advances in treatment but catching cancer early leads to better treatment options and overall, better survival for the patient,” Suarez-Ligon said.

So now what doctors are seeing is that people that are presenting with cancer are presenting at later stages because of the lack of screening that was encountered during the pandemic.

Signs and symptoms of possible breast cancer

Suarez-Ligon said self-breast exams are important. It’s less important on the exact way to do a self-exam and more important for people to know their body. If there are any changes in the skin of the breast, discharge from the nipple, any masses or

pain that hasn’t gone away, then these are symptoms that need to be presented to a doctor for possible additional screenings and mammographies.

Men can get breast cancer

While the rate of male breast cancer is low, Suarez-Ligon said they do have breast tissue prone to cancer. She suggested the same type of self-exam for men as she does women. Check for any abnormalities, masses, pain or discharges. These are abnormal and should be investigated further.

Simple lifestyle changes can reduce the risk of breast cancer

There are some things that are not preventable in terms of cancer risk, she said. Some people have a higher risk because of family history or exposure to environmental hazards. But there are simple lifestyle changes that we can do to reduce the risk of breast cancer.

Eat a healthier diet of less processed foods. More plant-based foods are very important. Get exercise at least five days a week. Exercise does not have to be any routine or any structure. Simply walking briskly for 30 minutes a day is enough to lower the risk of breast cancer, Suarez-Ligon said.

Avoid smoking and reduce alcohol intake. She said women should reduce their alcohol intake by one or less glasses per day.

WHY GAS PRICES DIDN'T DROP WITH NJ GAS TAX – AND NOW ARE RISING

It wasn't your imagination. Gas prices in New Jersey didn't go down when the gas tax dropped 8.3 cents last Friday.

And if you thought that was disappointing, you won't like what's next. Prices have started inching higher, and a jump of a nickel or more per gallon is anticipated in the days ahead.

It's not a conspiracy to line the pockets of gas stations, insists Sal Risalvato, executive director of the New Jersey Gasoline-Convenience-Automotive Association. He said there are valid reasons why prices were always going to go down slowly and that booming crude oil prices will now swamp the tax cut.

"I'll condemn anybody in this business anytime they need to be condemned. I have zero tolerance for dishonesty and cheating and whatnot," Risalvato said. "But, not lowering the price because the gas tax went down is not one of those things that they have done. It's not ethically wrong, morally wrong, legally wrong in any capacity."

The gas tax went down for fuel delivered starting Oct. 1, but Risalvato said stations still had thousands of gallons of inventory in their underground tanks on which they'd paid the higher rate.

"They had to buy it with the tax, so they can't just go out and drop their price because the tax went down because the gas that they're selling, they paid the tax on," Risalvato said.

The average statewide price in New Jersey didn't budge from \$3.226 for the first three days of October, according to data from the American Automobile Association, AAA. That was much different from a year ago, when the tax was raised 9.3 cents on Oct. 1 and the price at the pump rose 6 cents in three days.

Tracy Noble, manager of public and government affairs for AAA Mid-Atlantic, said the probable causes for the increase are a slight uptick in demand and the high price of crude oil.

"Gas prices throughout New Jersey remain at the highest levels of 2021, despite the recent decrease in the gas tax and seasonal shift to winter-blend fuels," Noble said. "We never see prices decrease as fast as they increase but the fact that they are increasing even with the recent gas tax decrease is certainly an anomaly."

But Risalvato said there's an explanation for why what goes up quickly comes down slowly.

"The state of New Jersey doesn't give them that tax back, which by the way is the exact opposite of what they do when the tax goes up," he said.

When the tax goes up, gas stations are sent a tax return by the state on which they must report how many gallons they have in their tanks and pay the state the new tax rate on that inventory.

"So, they go right out and they raise the price on the pump," Risalvato said. "In this case, the tax has already been paid. It went down. But, they can't just go out and drop the price because they already paid it, and the state of New Jersey ain't giving it back to them."

"The state is not giving anybody their tax money back. They're keeping it," he said. "So, blame the state."

Trucks delivering 8,800 gallons of gasoline arrive at some gas stations once or twice a day, but other stations can go days between deliveries. In time – in theory – that should have led gas prices to start to dropping most places by today or yesterday, Risalvato said.

However, the wholesale price of gas paid by the stations is now spiking.

"So, you're actually going to start seeing increases in the next day or so, probably in the 5-cent area," Risalvato said. "You wouldn't have seen the first 8 to 10 cents because of the tax decrease, but now the wholesale price was literally 15 cents a gallon higher at midnight last night than it was at midnight last Thursday."

Risalvato said he anticipates the price may climb 5 or 6 cents a gallon over the next few days to a week.

"Whatever the price on the pump is today, regardless of prices increases or decreases, it is definitely 8 cents lower than it would have been had they not lowered the tax," he said.

The average price of a gallon of regular unleaded in New Jersey rose one-tenth of a cent Monday, another one-tenth Tuesday and three-tenths Wednesday, to \$3.231,



according to AAA. Compared to the Sept. 30 price, that's a half-cent in six days – compared with 3.2 cents a gallon nationally, to \$3.221.

Risalvato said the wholesale price of gasoline has nothing to do with New Jersey's tax adjustment. It's the price across the country, reflecting the increase in the price of crude oil. The price of a barrel of oil had reached a three-year high before dipping Wednesday.

"Trust me, OPEC didn't increase prices because New Jersey's gas tax went down," he said. "... There is no way the people that trade crude oil said, 'Oh, we can raise the price of crude oil by this much because New Jersey lowered their gas tax by 8 cents.' I'll bet you they don't even know it."

Noble said global economic uncertainty and supply chain concerns caused by the COVID-19 pandemic could be playing a role in keeping crude oil prices elevated.

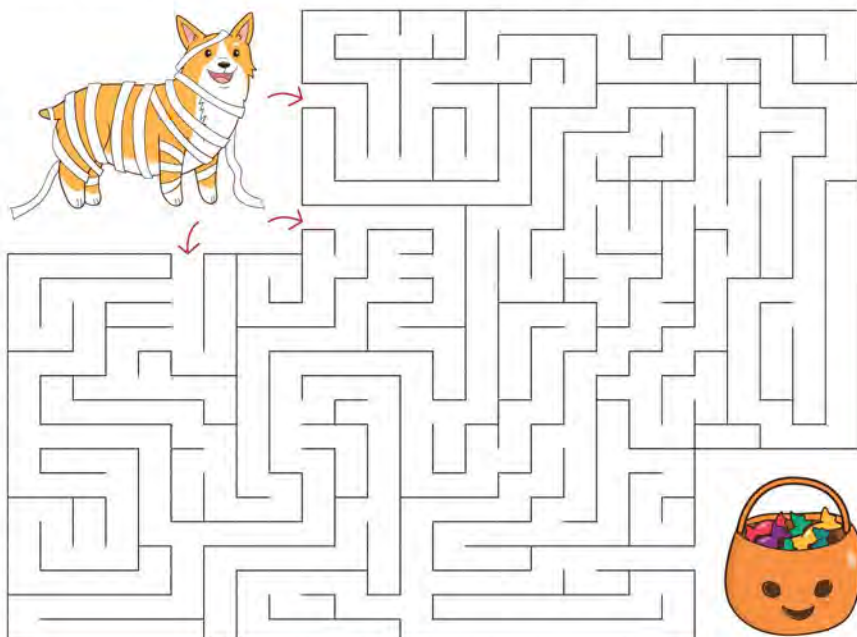

HOT DOG MUMMIES

Ingredients:

- One 8-ounce tube crescent dough
- 8 bun-length hot dogs
- 1 slice white American cheese
- Ketchup and/or mustard

Directions:

1. Preheat the oven to 375 degrees F. Line a rimmed baking sheet with parchment paper or a silicone mat.
2. Open the crescent dough tube and

- unroll the dough onto a work surface. Pinch together the seams to create a rectangle. Cut the dough lengthwise into 8 long strips.
3. Take 1 hot dog and 1 strip of the dough and wind the dough around the hot dog while pulling gently to stretch the dough. Crisscross the dough every so often so it looks like mummy wrappings. Near the end of the hot dog, leave a narrow strip of hot dog exposed so you can add eyes after baking. Place the wrapped dog on the prepared baking sheet and repeat with

- remaining dough and hot dogs. Bake until golden brown, about 15 minutes.
4. While hot dogs bake, use the narrow end of a wide piping tip to punch out 16 small rounds of cheese for the mummies' eyes.
5. Remove the hot dogs from oven. Using a toothpick, smear some ketchup on one side of each cheese round and "glue" it to the open area of the hot dog to create 2 eyes. Using the same toothpick, put a dab of ketchup or mustard in the center of each eye to create a pupil.
