## Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity

Throughout the year, Causeway CAREs gives back to local organizations in various ways. This is Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity's story of impact.

In the summer of 2022, Causeway CAREs in part, donated its 23rd vehicle to Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity (NOHFH) through its CauseWheels Vehicle Donation Program. NOHFH was \$20,000 short on the budget needed for the truck purchase. Causeway CAREs provided the CauseWheels program standard \$10,000 grant and arranged another \$10,000 grant from the Grunin Foundation. Since then, Kristine Novakowski, Executive Director of the Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity, says the truck has been a lifesaver.

“Soon after we received the truck, our only other construction truck broke down and could not be fixed,” she said. “Having the new truck allowed us to keep the repairs moving forward. We were able to complete 41 critical home repairs this year. And with the larger construction truck, we can accommodate more materials and tools on the truck, making our program run more efficiently.”

The truck has impacted the greater community, serving other nonprofit organizations with home repairs including two ARC group homes and five 21 Plus group homes. Additionally, NOHFH has completed work on their 21st and 22nd home builds with the assistance of the truck.



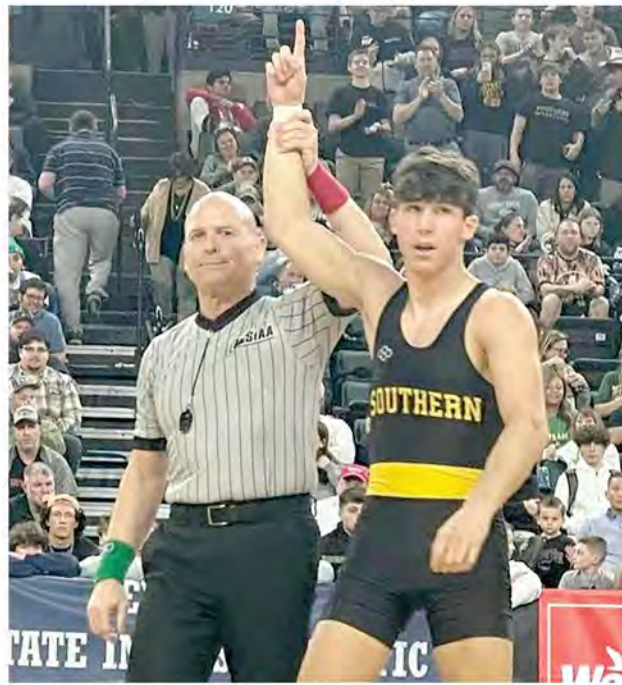

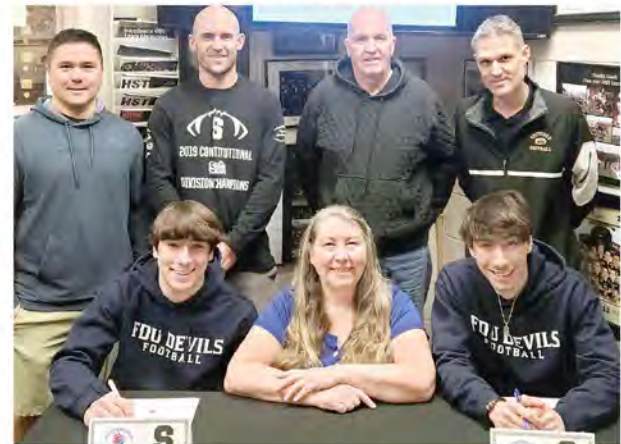

## WHEN 9 BIGGEST MEDICARE CHANGES UNDER NEW RX LAW GO INTO EFFECT

A year-by-year implementation timeline of the Inflation Reduction Act's health provisions

The Inflation Reduction Act of 2022 will transform Medicare's prescription drug coverage through provisions that for the first time will allow the program to negotiate prices of some medications with drugmakers, cap out-of-pocket costs for beneficiaries and make vital vaccines free to enrollees.

As with many new pieces of legislation, these changes will roll out over time. Here's a year-by-year look at how and when the landmark legislation will affect Medicare beneficiaries. The benefits of the law will apply both to people enrolled in original Medicare and those who belong to Medicare Advantage plans.

### 2023

**Vaccines:** Vaccines recommended for adults by the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention's Advisory Committee on Immunization Practices (ACIP) will be free to Medicare beneficiaries. Notably, the vaccine for shingles, a two-shot regimen that cost hundreds of dollars, will be available at no cost.

**Insulin:** Beginning this year and continuing through 2025, copays

for a 30-day supply of insulin covered by Medicare Part D will be capped at \$35. This copay amount will be in place even if you haven't yet satisfied your annual Part D deductible. In 2026 and beyond, the monthly insulin copay will be \$35 or 25 percent of the medication's negotiated price, whichever is lower.

### Price hike penalties:

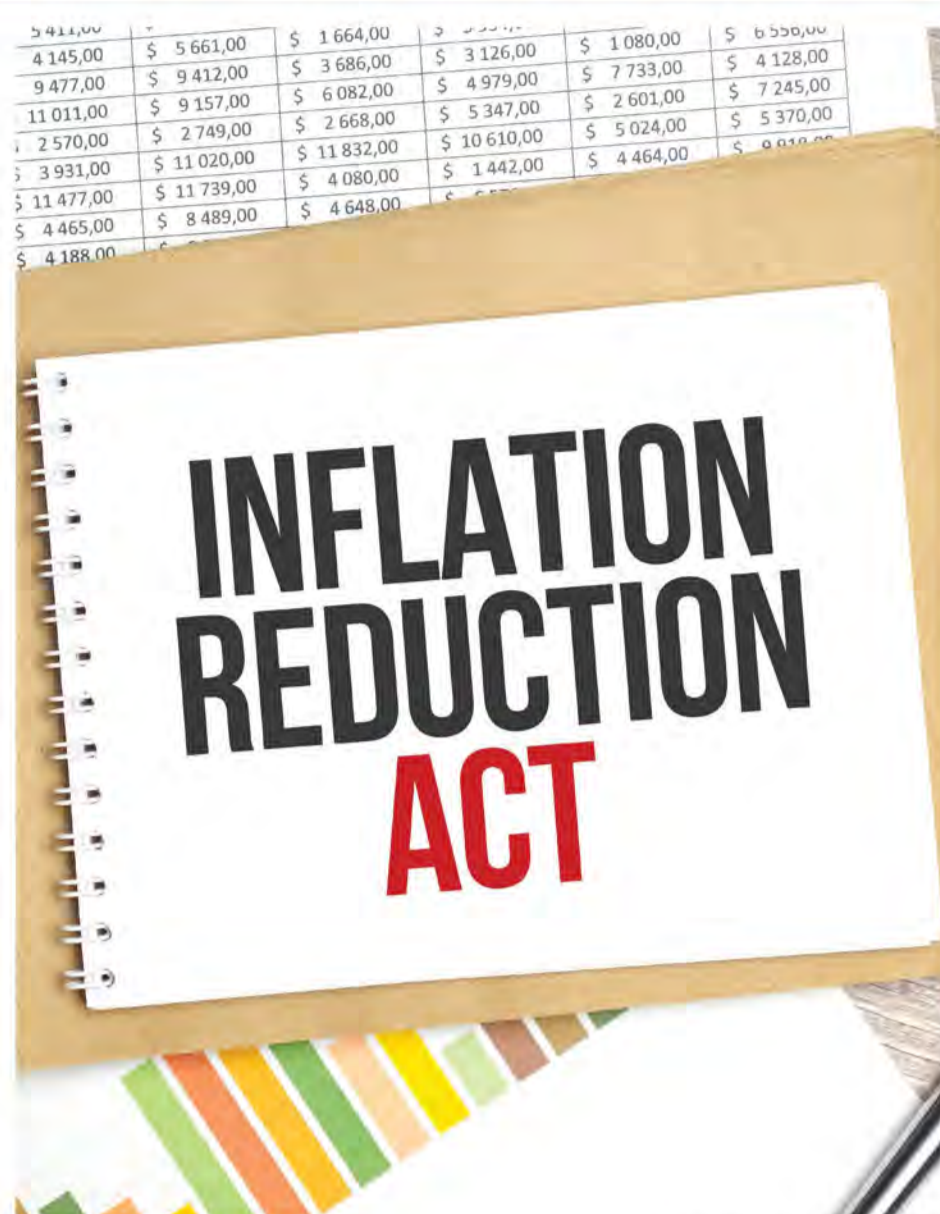
Pharmaceutical companies will be subject to penalties if they raise their prices more than the rate of general inflation. These companies will have to pay Medicare a rebate for the amount of their price hike that was above inflation. The penalty will apply to all Medicare sales of that particular drug.

### 2024

**Part D out-of-pocket costs:** Part D plan members whose drug costs are so high that they enter the catastrophic phase of coverage will not have any more out-of-pocket costs for the rest of the year. In 2022, the out-of-pocket threshold for that coverage phase is \$7,050, a limit that generally increases every year. Until 2024, the 5 percent copay for catastrophic coverage will remain in effect.

**Part D premium limitation:** From 2024 through 2029, Part D plans cannot increase their premiums more than 6 percent per year. Beyond 2029, it will be up to the secretary of Health and Human Services to determine the premium growth limit.

**Financial aid:** The government will expand the eligibility for

the Extra Help program, which assists people with limited incomes in affording their prescription drug costs, such as premiums and copays. This year the income threshold that will qualify Medicare enrollees for the program will increase from 135 percent of the federal poverty level to 150 percent (\$20,385 for an individual in 2022).

### 2025

**Out-of-pocket-cap:** The maximum amount people with Medicare will have to pay out of pocket for their prescription drugs will be \$2,000 a year. This limit, the first of its kind, will apply both to people with stand-alone Part D plans and to people who get their drug coverage through a Medicare Advantage plan.

**Paying Part D premiums:** Part D members will have the option of spreading out cost-sharing

payments over the course of the year, something Medicare is calling "smoothed" cost sharing. This is designed to protect people from being hit with such a big drug bill at one time that it might discourage them from filling or taking a prescription.

### 2026

**Price negotiations:** Consumers will begin to benefit from the first 10 prescription drugs under Part D that will be subject to price negotiations. Medicare will negotiate prices for up to 10 drugs in 2026, up to 15 drugs in 2027 and 2028, and up to 20 drugs in 2029 and beyond. By 2029, that means a total of up to 60 drugs could be subject to negotiation. For Medicare Part B drugs (those typically administered in a hospital or doctor's office), price negotiations will take effect in 2028.

## HOW TO SCAN A QR CODE WITH YOUR SMARTPHONE OR TABLET

The camera on your Apple or Android device can read it automatically

As companies and government offices look for ways to save on paper and labor costs, you'll find more and more leaflets and signs with QR codes.

QR codes, short for quick response, have been around for nearly 30 years. Japanese company Denso Wave, formerly a part of Toyota Motor Corp., developed the idea in 1994 while looking for a way to squeeze more information about auto parts inventories into the space available on existing barcodes, like the ones you see on grocery items.

You probably noticed QR codes early in the pandemic as restaurants jettisoned paper menus

because of fears of COVID-19 contamination. Half of full-service restaurants had added digital menus accessed through QR codes by the end of 2020, according to a National Restaurant Association survey.

The next year, as more people began visiting businesses again and service industries faced labor shortages, many retailers pitched their customers to apply for jobs with QR code signs and flyers. QR codes give you an instant link to a specific web page, a boon if you want to get to a spot within a website rather than its more general home page.

When you encounter a QR code, you'll have to pull up your smartphone or tablet camera to find out more information. But you don't — and shouldn't — take a picture.

1. Point your camera at the code. It doesn't matter whether you're holding your phone vertically or

horizontally, and your phone can even read the code upside down if it isn't facing you.

2. When your camera scans the QR code, you'll see an icon or web address on your screen near the code. Tap it.

3. You'll go to the associated website via your phone's web browser, which should launch automatically.

If your smartphone or tablet's operating system is up to date, you should be able to read a QR code and navigate to its website

without additional software. Although free QR reader apps are available in the Apple and Google Play app stores, you won't need them, and some could expose you to malware. Apple built a QR reader into iOS 11 in 2017, and Google followed with its Android 9 operating system, also known as Android Pie, in 2018.

Before you scan, be aware of where the QR code is coming from and whether it looks as if it's been tampered with. The web address you see as you hover over the code should be something expected, such as a company's website for job information or a restaurant's site for a menu.

As QR codes have become more familiar to people of all ages, scammers have stepped in to take advantage of that, according to the FBI. Their alterations or completely faked QR codes can lead you to fraudulent websites and potential identity theft. Be especially wary if you're asked to make a financial transaction using a QR code.

#### Ingredients:

- 2 cups packed brown sugar
- 1 (8 pound) cured, bone-in picnic ham

- Step 1:** Spread about 1 1/2 cups of brown sugar on the bottom of a slow cooker.
- Step 2:** Place ham on the brown sugar with the flat side facing down; you might have to trim it a little to make it fit. Use your hands to rub the remaining brown sugar onto the ham.
- Step 3:** Cover, and cook on Low for 8 hours.

- 3 pounds potatoes, thinly sliced
- 1/2 onion, thinly sliced
- 9 tablespoons all-purpose flour, divided
- 6 tablespoons butter, diced and divided
- Salt and ground black pepper to taste
- 3 cups whole milk, or as needed

#### Directions:

- Step 1:** Preheat oven to 375 degrees F (190 degrees C). Grease a 9x13-inch baking dish.
- Step 2:** Spread about 1/3 of the potato slices into the bottom of the prepared baking dish. Top with about 1/3 of the onion slices. Sprinkle 3 tablespoons flour over the potato and onion. Arrange 2 tablespoons butter atop the flour. Season the entire layer with salt and pepper. Repeat layering twice more.
- Step 3:** Heat milk in a saucepan until warm. Pour enough warm milk over the mixture in the baking dish so the top of the liquid is level with the final layer of potatoes.
- Step 4:** Bake in the preheated oven until potatoes are tender, 45 to 60 minutes.

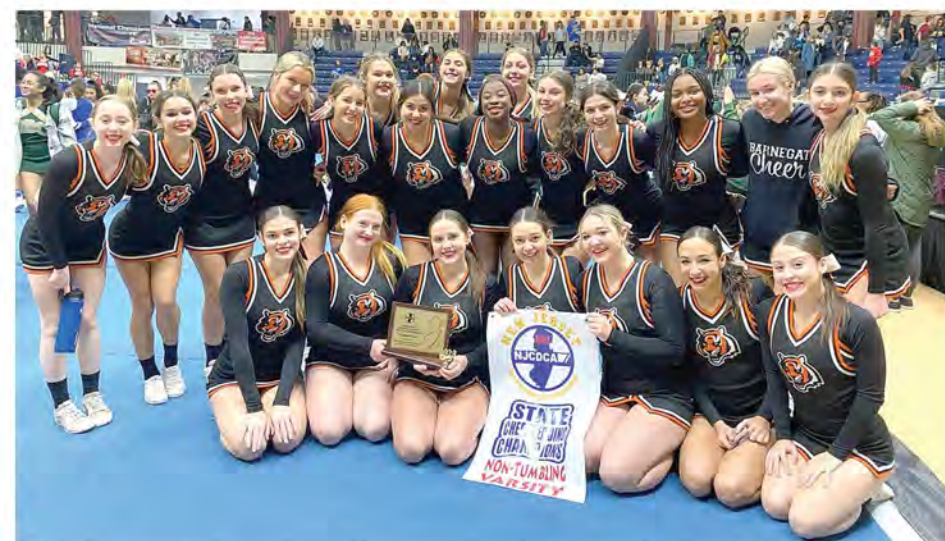

"This Wawa will not only relieve traffic congestion for those who live on the west, it will also give easy access to gas for those who live on the east side of the Parkway," he said.

It will also boost Barnegat's tax base, he said. No details were shared about construction and opening timelines.

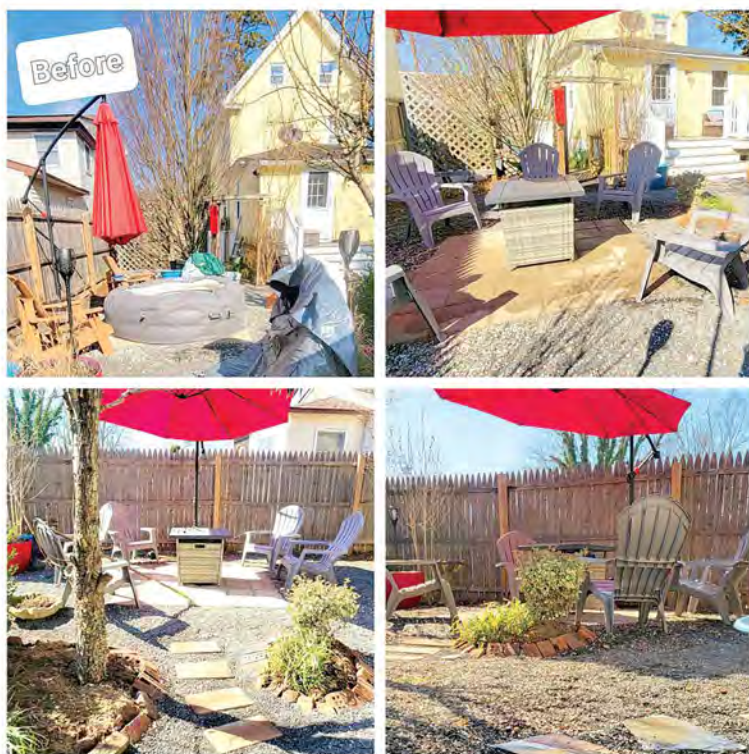
I can't believe how great this winter has been! March is always the time of year that I clean up and redo all of my outdoor spaces. Each year I change things around and make small improvements.

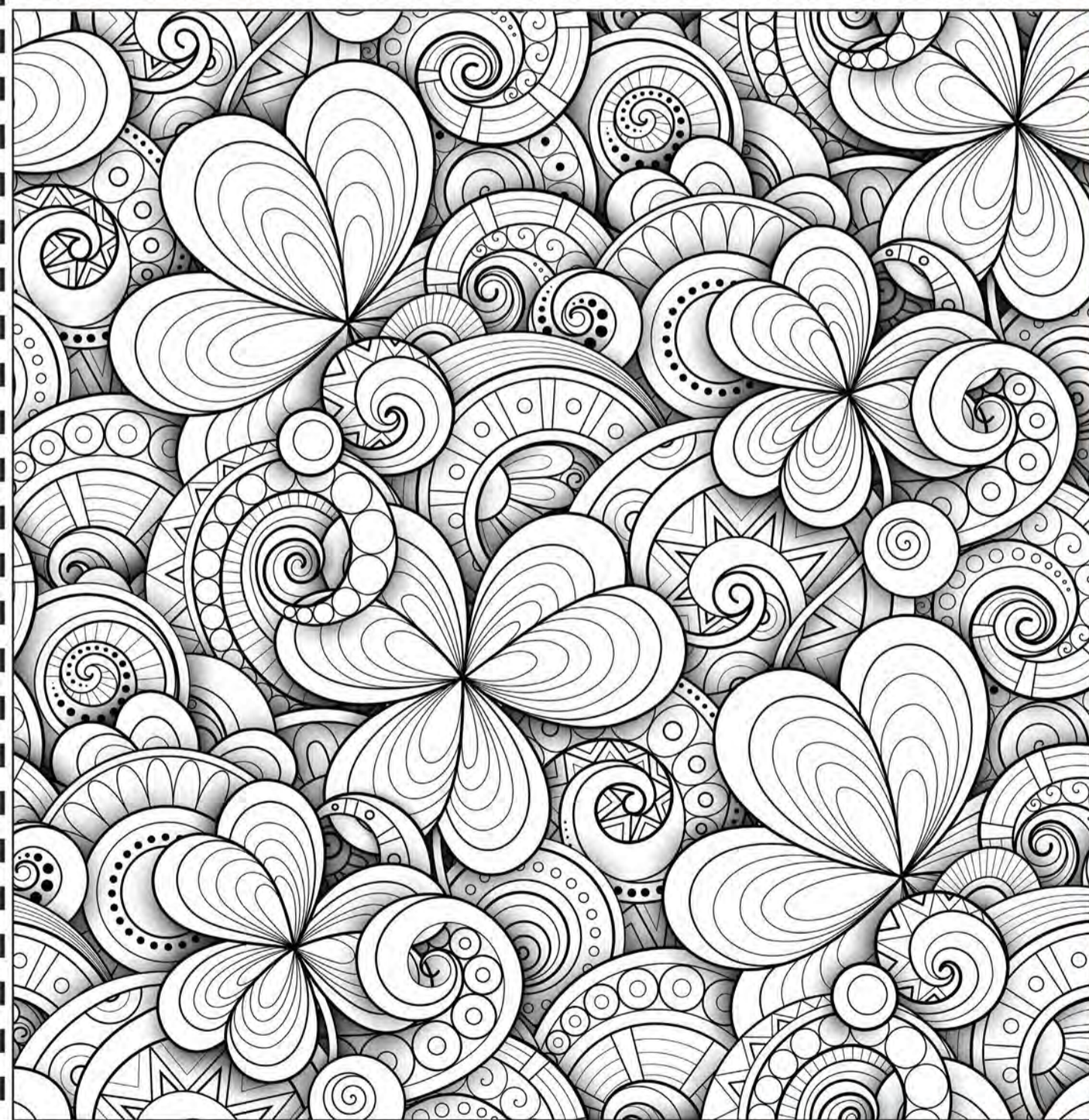
