Meals on Wheels of Ocean County (MOWOC) is More Than Meals! We deliver 1,000 hot meals and provide social contact and vital wellness checks every day to help homebound seniors live independently and safely where they are most comfortable - at home. MOWOC has been serving the community for over 50 years, showing resilience and perseverance during significant challenges. When Superstorm Sandy disabled our kitchens, we partnered with a local restaurant to ensure hot meals were provided, missing only two days of delivery. During Covid-19, we were a steadfast presence and partner organizations used us to deliver essential items to the homebound. Every day MOWOC proves that we are More Than a Meal, especially in times of crisis.

The demand for Meals on Wheels services to help seniors age safely at home is greater than it has ever been. Just ten years ago, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County received 20-30 referrals a month, now we receive 20-30 referrals a week. With over 200,000 seniors living in Ocean County the need for Meals on Wheels

MOWOC addresses senior nutrition and safety, reducing costs that would otherwise fall to the senior, their families, or governments.

Meals on Wheels of Ocean County can serve a senior for an entire year for roughly the same cost as one

We are asking YOU, the community, to make an investment in helping Meals on Wheels of Ocean County. The impact YOU can have on Ocean County older adults is indispensable.

Today, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County not only provides home delivered meals but also hosts the Stafford Community Café (onsite meals and activities) and Social Support Services to the seniors of Ocean County who are 60 and older. We also provide nutrition education and counseling to promote and

enhance our participant's wellbeing. Our drivers become a familiar friendly face to our older residents, they not only deliver the meal and a smile but the important daily safety and wellness check that our seniors and their loved ones depend on.

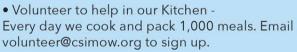
Meals on Wheels of Ocean County works with many amazing service organizations to help our older adults age in place. Some of our Community Impact Partners are St. Francis Community Center, Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity (Project Home Repair), Catholic Charities, Interfaith, and Ocean Ride just to name a few. All these organizations work to help seniors remain independent at home by addressing either food security, transportation, mental health, accessibility, and socialization needs. The vision of Meals on Wheels of Ocean County is an Ocean County where all seniors live fully nourished lives, both mentally and physically, and we cannot accomplish this alone. Together we are More Than Meals.

Meals on Wheels of Ocean County is a frontline protector of senior health and safety providing daily social contact and wellness checks for our homebound seniors. Since June of 2024, MOWOC has called EMS or the police more than 30 times when our participants did not answer their door. In many instances, the seniors were found incapacitated on the floor and could not get up to answer the door.

This past April, one of our participants, Rose, did not answer her door or phone when our driver arrived to deliver her meal. A maintenance worker who was working outside told our driver that Rose was not home. Our driver noticed a grocery delivery sitting by the front door and thought that something just wasn't right. Following protocols,

we called Rose's emergency contact to see if they could tell us where she might be. Our attempts

to locate her whereabouts were unsuccessful so the Meals on Wheels office called the local police department to conduct a wellness check. When the police arrived, they found Rose on the floor suffering from a medical episode. Rose was transported to the hospital where she was able to receive medical treatment. If it were not for our daily safety and wellness check, we do not know if or when Rose would have received help.

Meals on Wheels of Ocean County often asks our participants for feedback on our services and their well-being. Here are some numbers that prove Meals on Wheels of Ocean County is More Than Meals and that we make a difference every day in our seniors' lives.

- 98% feel more confident living independently due to Meals on Wheels of Ocean County
- 83% would not have a daily hot meal if not for Meals on Wheels of Ocean County
- 98% eat a more balanced diet because of Meals on Wheels of Ocean County
- 95% feel less lonely because the receive daily meals

HELP FAMILY PROMISE OF THE JERSEY SHORE CHANGE HOW HOMELESSNESS LOOKS IN OCEAN COUNTY

Since joining Family Promise of the Jersey Shore a few years ago I have had a similar conversation with well-meaning folks many times.

"I saw these homeless people the other day," it begins.

The location is usually some public area such as outside a store, in a park or by a library.

"How do you know they are homeless," I ask. "Did they tell you?"

"No, I didn't talk to them," they say.

"Then how do you know they are homeless?"

"Well, they looked homeless."

Maybe the people they saw were experiencing homelessness but the truth is homelessness doesn't have a look.

Homelessness has many human faces. Many of them you may not notice as homeless as they cross your path daily.

You may not notice them blowing through their savings by staying in a motel as they serve you coffee or help you at checkout at your favorite store.



You may not see them sleeping in their cars in the parking lots of box stores at midnight only to wake in the morning to go to work at a doctor's office or a school.

You can't see them couch surfing, bouncing between friends and family night after night while attending college full time and holding down a job.

Chances are you won't notice the 70 or 80 people who call us every day needing help to stay in their homes after one of life's setbacks.

You wouldn't notice the families in our family shelter program as they go about their day of work and school.

We rarely share or post pictures of the individuals and families we help. Beyond professionalism and confidentiality, we treat every single person who reaches out to us with respect and dignity, and honor their privacy.

Recently a mom in our program said she wanted to share a little of her story and how Family Promise of the Jersey Shore was helping her family. We agreed on a picture.

The photograph is a silhouette of a mother sharing a happy moment with her child in the kitchen in our day

Homelessness can also look like this as we work to help families and individuals secure a place to call home.

The number of our neighbors facing homelessness continues to grow, outpacing resources and funding for services to assist those in need.

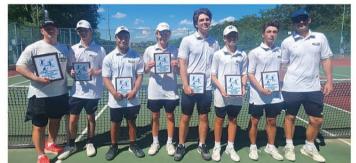

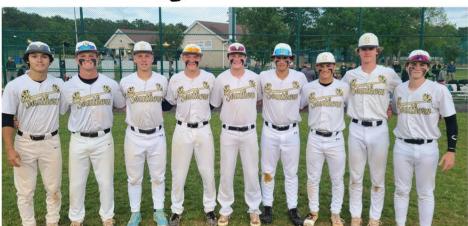

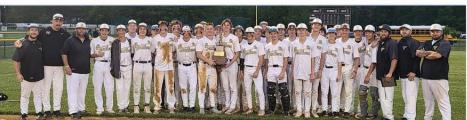

FULFILL CAPACITY GRANTS USED TO SUPPORT LOCAL PANTRIES

Monmouth Worship Center Food Pantry receives freezer to increase capacity amongst growing demand

Neptune, NJ - "This is so wonderful. You have no

That's how a grateful member of the community recently responded to volunteers at the Monmouth Worship Center Food Pantry in Marlboro. They made the comment after picking up nutritious meal items, including frozen food, thanks in part to a grant from Fulfill, the Food Bank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties.

Monmouth Worship Center Food Pantry is among over 300 Fulfill partners in Monmouth and Ocean counties, 28 of which have been awarded grants from Fulfill thus far in Fiscal Year 2025 (July 2024-June 2025). The Worship Center used the funds to purchase a chest freezer that increased its capacity to store frozen food by approximately 30%.

Fulfill has awarded more than \$66,000 in 37 capacity grants since July 2024.

"Most of us have no idea about how much work goes into the work pantries and soup kitchens do behind the scenes," said The Rev. Rosemarie Broderick, Executive Director, Center for Community Renewal and Clergy-in-Charge at Saint Mark's Episcopal Church in Keansburg. Broderick is also chair of the APAC (Agency Partner Advisory Committee) committee, which determines which capacity grants can be awards, as well as member of Fulfill's Board of Trustees. "To store and distribute fresh, nutritious

food they need functioning freezers, refrigerators, water dispensers and more. They might need anything from utensils to tables, ceiling fans to wheelchairs, and shelves to shopping carts to provide their core services to those in need."

The capacity grants allow Fulfill's network of pantry partners to request funds from the Food Bank to improve their facilities to serve neighbors in need. Freezers and refrigerators are the most commonly requested item Fulfill's team has addressed. Fulfill offers these grants as a part of its mission to ensure a strong network of partners where those experiencing hunger can access healthy, nutritious foods.

"We can now keep a richer variety of meats, vegetables and fruits fresher and longer for those in need," said Carmelita Froome, Worship Center volunteer. "We can better streamline distribution and meal planning. Another benefit is that we can offer these nutritious, protein- and nutrient-rich foods to all of our patrons, rather than only to those who are first to arrive on distribution days."

The freezer helps Froome and other volunteers provide sustenance to far more individuals now than the center's smaller, older freezer, which had recently broken. Froome and fellow volunteers are already thinking ahead to the Thanksgiving holiday, when the new freezer will allow them to store more turkeys and staples for holiday tables.

"Our Capacity Grant Program is one of many innovative ways we address hunger in our community," said The Rev. Broderick. "We proudly fuel inventive ways to help the increasing number of our neighbors who are food insecure. We are grateful for the donations from individuals and organizations that make these efforts possible."

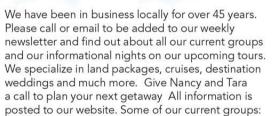

EXERCISE IS CRUCIAL FOR MANAGING PARKINSON'S DISEASE

"Exercise is one of the most powerful ways to change someone's course with Parkinson's," says Jori Fleisher, M.D., a movement disorder specialist and associate professor of neurological sciences at Rush University in Chicago. "Even if you are a never-exerciser, that's OK. Start today."

A growing body of research finds that regular physical activity the kind that gets the body moving and the heart pumping — can significantly reduce the severity of PD symptoms and how fast they progress. Research highlights the benefits of:

- · High-intensity interval training, or HIIT

Exercise is good medicine

Exercise is therapeutic for people with Parkinson's disease. That was the conclusion of a 2024 analysis in the Journal of Neurology, Neurosurgery and Psychiatry, which reviewed research articles published over the past several years that explored the benefits of exercise for people with PD.

While there's far more published research on the effects of vigorous

physical activity in mice bred to have PD symptoms, the existing evidence on the benefits of exercise in people with the disease is very promising.

"Exercise has multiple clinical benefits in Parkinson's disease," says exercise physiologist Martin Langeskov-Christensen, associate professor in the department of clinical medicine at Aarhus University in Denmark and an author of the 2024 analysis. "It actually addresses both motor and non-motor symptoms." Motor symptoms are related to movement, like walking and keeping your balance. Non-motor symptoms can include depression, anxiety, sleep troubles and cognitive problems.

In one study included in his team's analysis, researchers followed 237 people with early PD for an average of five years. Those who maintained regular levels of physical activity over that time saw a slower decline in their ability to perform activities of daily life.

Keeping your body moving might improve or stabilize motor symptoms like walking and balance problems. You've probably also heard - or even experienced firsthand — how exercise can improve problems unrelated to movement, including

low mood, fatigue, sleep troubles and constipation.

"People will complain of abdominal pain from slowed gastric motility, and the first thing we say is, 'Exercise,'" says Rebecca Gilbert, M.D., chief mission officer, American Parkinson's Disease Association After a meal, "take a walk around the block, get everything moving,' she recommends.

Intense exercise may enhance brain circuitry

There's some evidence that increased exercise in people who have Parkinson's may interfere with the underlying disease processes that cause these symptoms.

Though the research is still in the early stages, there are some positive signs that exercise affects neuroplasticity. Simply put, neuroplasticity is the brain's ability to change and adapt in response to learning, experiences or injury. That means that even in the face of a disease that is killing cells in the brain, the brain can still change in response to the positive effects of exercise.

Parkinson's disease involves a loss of the brain cells that produce dopamine, a chemical messenger that is critical to movement and mood, among other functions. "There are a few studies, using PET scans of the brain, that show that after six months of aerobic exercise, dopamine levels

increase in the brain," Langeskov-

Christensen says. One small study, published in npj Parkinson's Disease in 2024, found that high-intensity exercise might slow the neurodegeneration that PD causes. In the study, 10 people with mild and early PD participated in the Beat Parkinson's Today exercise program, which involved highintensity workouts, including cardio and strength training at least three times a week for six months. Participants wore heart monitors to ensure their hearts

were beating at around 80 percent of the max capacity for their age. Signs that you're pushing yourself hard enough include sweating, heavy breathing and an inability to say more than a few words without taking another breath.

Brain MRI and PET scans taken before the program began and six months later showed signs in 9 out of the 10 participants that the dopamine-producing brain cells probably became healthier.

"We knew that exercise was good for symptoms, but this study shows that it's actually neuroprotective," says study coauthor Sule Tinaz, M.D., associate professor of neurology at Yale School of Medicine. Tinaz and her colleagues hope to replicate the results of this study in a larger randomized controlled clinical trial.

What kind of exercise works best?

By now you may have put on your sneakers and are ready to get started. So what kind of exercise helps people with PD?

Much of the research on this

known as "cardio," it's the kind of exercise that gets your body moving and your heart pumping, like dancing, jogging, swimming, tennis, cycling, brisk walking and stair climbing. The emphasis here is on getting your heart rate and breathing up above your general resting state. "You want to make sure people are pushed," Gilbert says. Taking a brief stroll around the block without raising your heart rate is probably not as good as really getting a workout in, she adds. The Parkinson's Foundation's exercise guidelines call for at least 90 minutes of cardio as part of 150 minutes of moderate to vigorous exercise each week. The Foundation recommends that everyone with PD see a physical therapist specializing in PD for a full functional evaluation and recommends exercise during "on" periods, when taking medication. According to the Parkinson's

Foundation, your weekly 150 minutes of moderate to vigorous exercise should include:

- Aerobic activity: 3 days/week at least 30 minutes per session of continuous or intermittent movement at moderate or high intensity
- Strength or resistance training: 2-3 nonconsecutive days/week for at least 30 minutes per session
- · Balance, agility and multitasking: At least 2-3 days/ week — every day, if possible of exercises that rely on these skills
- Stretching: At least 2-3 days/ week; every day, if possible.

Start where you are...with a push

How to raise your heart rate, and how much, depends on your current fitness level and abilities, your medical history, your medications and other individual health factors. If you're not a regular exerciser yet, it might not take much to get your heart rate up, or you may take medications that mean you shouldn't increase your heart rate past a certain point. But if you've been working out regularly for a while, you may need more intense physical activity to get your heart pumping

In the study that tracked 237 people with early Parkinson's for five years, people benefited from exercise regardless of their fitness level or physical abilities at the start of the study.

This shows it's never too late to start exercising to get long-term benefits — no matter your fitness level or your disease stage. Start with whatever is a challenge for you and work your way up to 150 minutes of exercise activity per week, Gilbert says.

"Exercise is one of the best things we can do for ourselves, especially when living with Parkinson's. Knowing that, many people ask not just 'what's the best exercise?' but also 'how much should I exercise?' That's a balance each person has to find for themselves. Exercise should feel hard. It should challenge you and make you sore and somewhat fatigued. But not so sore that you are injured or so exhausted that you can't do your normal activities," neurology and lifestyle medicine physician and movement disorder specialist, Rachel Dolhun, M.D., principal medical advisor at The Michael J. Fox Foundation wrote on LinkedIn in May in response to a recent report on the possibility of overexercise with Parkinson's.

Choose exercises that challenge your brain

What was that about dance and learning new skills? You may get more benefits from exercise that challenges your brain to think and learn while you move your body, Gilbert says, like dance.

"Learning something new, learning how to move in a new

way, can change the biology of the brain," she says. Animal studies, she says, have shown that a moderate-intensity but mentally challenging exercise may improve blood flow to the brain more than a high-intensity but familiar exercise would.

So, given the choice between the same daily brisk walk and your first-ever tango class, choose tango

Dancing, in fact, may not only raise your heart rate and teach you something new, but it may also benefit your mood. For some people with PD, depression takes a greater toll on quality of life than movement problems do.

In a study published in 2024 in the Journal of Medical Internet Research, 23 people with PD took weekly dance classes at Canada's National Ballet School for eight months. Building on previous research that showed dance classes helped with movement, mood and functions of daily living, this study found that after the dance classes, participants reported fewer symptoms of

depression, and MRIs showed fewer biological signs of depression.

Besides the exercise and learning components, dance classes also give you a chance to socialize, which can help reduce symptoms of depression.

Boxing has gotten support from Parkinson's research studies as well. Several small studies have shown that boxing can improve motor and non-motor symptoms of the disease. Researchers suggest it's the aerobic and strength training, along with balance and footwork and stretching that's beneficial. Group boxing classes, like dance classes, also come with camaraderie built in.

Whether it's tango, pickleball or ping-pong, pick something you'll enjoy so that you stick with it. "When you have Parkinson's disease," Langeskov-Christensen says, "it becomes more difficult to motivate yourself. You should really do ... what motivates you."

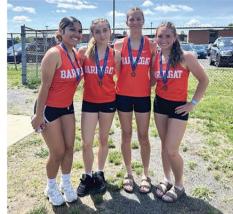

AWARD-WINNING BARNEGAT 5TH GRADER SEES FINANCE CLASS PAY OFF IN DIVIDENDS

Fifth grader Nolan Nguyen created a (fake) investment portfolio in class. It paid off in the form of a national award.

BARNEGAT, NJ — Skip the financial advisor next time you have questions about stocks - this Barnegat elementary schooler has you covered.

Nolan Nguyen, a fifth grade student at Robert L. Horbelt Elementary School, created a long-term investment plan that won him first prize in New Jersey and third place nationally in the SIFMA Foundation's Fall 2024 InvestWrite competition, the organization announced in a news release.

His essay was chosen from thousands of entries and displayed a clear understanding of diversification, longterm investing and risk, according to the SIFMA Foundation (read his essay at the end of this article). Nguyen and his teacher, Roy Huff, were honored at a ceremony on May 29.

InvestWrite is the capstone to the SIFMA Foundation's Stock Market Game, a curriculum-based simulation in which students manage a hypothetical \$100,000 portfolio of stocks, bonds, mutual funds and cash. The program has reached more than 23 million students since 1977.

"We're thrilled to celebrate Nolan for this outstanding achievement," said Melanie Mortimer, President of the SIFMA Foundation. "This is a powerful example of how financial education helps young people take control of their futures. By understanding longterm investing, students like Nolan are building not just portfolios, but real financial confidence, know-how and independence."

Each year, InvestWrite challenges students to apply what they've learned in the Stock Market Game to a realworld investing scenario. Thousands of financial professionals across the country volunteer to judge the essays, selecting winners who demonstrate depth of knowledge, critical thinking, and a practical vision for financial independence.

In the Fall essay writing competition, 4th-12th grade students were asked to reflect on their Stock Market Game portfolios and consider the following questions: "Was your portfolio diversified? If so, how? If not, how could you make it more diversified for long-term financial success?" Students were challenged to explain their investment strategy and recommend a future approach to saving or investing that reflects their understanding of a sound, diversified financial plan.

the 11 sectors based on size is as follows: Infor-mation Technology, Healthcare, Financials, Consumer Dis-cretionary, Communication Services, Industrials, Consum-er Staples, Energy, Utilities, Real Estate, and Materials. (That was a mouthful!) My teacher used the phrase "Don't put all your eggs in one basket." A portfolio is a col-lection of really anything and everything, but in this instance, we are referring to a collection of stocks, bonds, (basically an IOU, but with interest), and mutual funds,

Have you ever heard of the word's diversification, stocks, mutual funds, bonds, index funds, shorting?... I could really go on with this all day, but you're probably wondering where I learned all these words. In my Gifted and Talented class, my fellow peers and I played the Stock Market Game.

Now you're probably thinking, "You've only confused me more! What is the Stock Market Game?" So, for all you poor souls who don't know, a stock is a share of a company. So now, you're probably thinking "I see! The Stock Market Game is where you buy stocks!" But still wrong. The Stock Market Game is where you buy stocks using pretend money, so you don't go bankrupt. ("Game," anyone?)

First, let me explain some other words. Diversification is when you spread your investments in a variety of companies in different sectors. You can also invest in things like gold and silver. From my reading of The Motley Fool, the order of

(a mutual fund is basically a whole lot of stocks grouped together) basically anything and everything financial. A short sale (shorting for short (pun not intended, promise) is betting on a stock to go down.

Going off the previous paragraph, let's talk about diversifying your portfolio. You can probably figure this one out at first glance, but if you don't know, it's basically like my teacher said, "Not putting all your eggs into one basket." The concept is simply investing in stocks from different sectors to add to your portfolio. (That's simple now that you look at it, right?) Although you are probably thinking "Why would I want to do this?" The answer is, really simple. For example, if you invest in both healthcare and technology stocks, and technology stocks go down, you, at the least, will just not lose as much money, (it's also really based on how good your stocks are) because your healthcare stocks are still doing alright. (That's simple now that you look at it, right?)

Now, let's talk about diversifying my portfolio. Below are my stocks, and

then after that I will explain how my

portfolio is diversified. • Apple - 10 shares

Tesla - 40 shares

I shall now explain how my portfolio is diversified. For example, while Constellation Energy is in the energy sector, Spotify is in the communication services sector, and Baron Partners Fund R6 Shares alone has stocks in Consumer Discretionary, Industrials, Financials, Real Estate, Information Technology, and Healthcare sectors. You are prob-ably thinking, "Will this kid ever stop shooting off his yapper?"...and the answer is no. This is just the beginning. I will point out how my portfolio is, sadly, not diversified. For example, Duolingo and Nvidia are both in the Information Technology sector, Netflix and PepsiCo in Consumer Discretionary, (along with Reddit) and...that's really it. Lastly, to analyze the performance of my portfolio. This is pretty short. My portfolio is actually really volatile, (Bumpy, up-down, you get the idea.) but if you look at the bigger picture, it basically just goes up over the past two months I've been playing the Stock Market Game.

Overall, my experience with the Stock Market Game was super exciting, educational, and really just interesting, and the great thing is that I can use these skills later on. I hope that you learned a lot (Although this really wasn't meant to be educational to any readers) throughout this essay, and I just hope you enjoyed it. Nothing else I really have to say, except... well... The process is just so simple once you break it down!!! (*Sigh* and to think I spent six hours working on this essay every weekend...) patch.com
