RECIPIENTS ANNOUNCED

The countdown is on for the 8th Annual Causeway CAREs 5K, happening October 12, 2025 at Southern Regional High School. This community event brings runners, walkers, and supporters together for a morning of fitness, fun, and philanthropy. This year's proceeds will benefit three incredible local organizations: Fulfill, Project Home Repair, and, new this year, Meals on Wheels of Ocean County.

Over the past seven years, the Causeway CAREs 5K has raised more than \$305,000 for local nonprofits. Last year alone, the event brought in \$90,200, and our goal this year is to raise even more. With your participation and the generous support of our sponsors, we know it is possible.

This Year's Beneficiaries

Fulfill

Fulfill is dedicated to ending hunger in Monmouth and Ocean Counties by addressing its root causes. While their primary function is to provide food to a vast network of over 300 local food pantries, soup kitchens, and shelters, their mission extends far beyond immediate relief. They are committed to building long term food security by connecting people with essential resources. Their programs help individuals and families access vital assistance like SNAP benefits and affordable healthcare, while also offering job training and financial literacy workshops that empower them to achieve self sufficiency. Fulfill's holistic approach ensures that they not only feed people today but also create pathways to a more secure and stable tomorrow.

"Food insecurity continues to be a major issue in Monmouth and Ocean Counties. Visits to partner agency food pantries are up 40% year over year. Project Home Repair

Project Home Repair is a collaborative effort that provides critical home repairs to senior, veteran, and other vulnerable populations in Ocean County. This vital initiative is driven by the belief that everyone deserves to live safely and with dignity in their own home.

Since its inception in July 2023, Project Home Repair has made significant strides in improving the quality of life for vulnerable populations in Ocean County. A collective initiative driven by Causeway CAREs, Project Home Repair brings together local organizations including: Northern Ocean Habitat for Humanity, Homes for All, Southern Ocean Habitat for Humanity, and Starve Poverty International to address the increasing demand for critical home repairs among seniors, veterans, and those facing physical challenges.

The coalition, founded by Dave C. Wintrade, President of the Causeway Family of Dealerships and Causeway CAREs, was formed to bridge the gap in services and resources needed to repair homes that provide safety and dignity to individuals living in difficult conditions.

By partnering with these local organizations, Project Home Repair addresses a wide range of health and safety hazards from replacing leaking roofs and rebuilding unstable front steps to installing essential accessibility features like ADA compliant ramps and grab bars. Their work makes a tangible and immediate impact, helping

This summer continues to be one of the busiest ever for us at Family Promise of the Jersey Shore.

According to a newly released report, the number of people experiencing homelessness in New Jersey increased to 13,748. That figure is up 8% from last year and the highest in a decade.

Of course reports only offer part of the picture. In reality, far more of our neighbors are now facing homelessness. We see and hear it everyday.

We receive between 80 and 100 phone calls a day from people looking for assistance

with shelter, rent arrears, utility bills or a date in landlord-tenant court.

A daunting task, our professional staff performs meticulous work every day fielding these pleas for help.

In 2024 Family Promise of the Jersey Shore assisted more than 5,800 people who sought our help. In the first six months of this year we have helped more than 6,000 individuals.

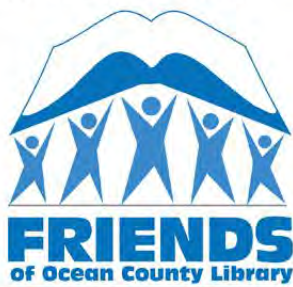

4-INGREDIENT HAMBURGER CASSEROLE

Ingredients:

- 8 ounces pasta
- 1 pound ground beef
- Salt, freshly ground black pepper, and garlic powder, to taste
- 1 10-ounce can tomato soup
- 8 ounces shredded mozzarella cheese, divided

Directions:

- Step 1:** Preheat the oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C).
- Step 2:** Fill a large pot with lightly salted water and bring to a rolling boil. Stir in pasta and return to a boil. Cook, uncovered, stirring occasionally, until tender yet firm to the bite, about 10 minutes. Drain pasta, reserving about 2 tablespoons pasta water.
- Step 3:** Meanwhile, heat a large skillet over medium-high heat. Cook and stir ground beef in the hot skillet until browned and crumbly, 5 to 7 minutes; season with salt, pepper, and garlic powder. Drain and discard grease.
- Step 4:** Place ground beef in a large round casserole dish. Add pasta on top; sprinkle with half the cheese. Pour tomato soup on top; add reserved pasta water and stir everything together well. Cover with foil.
- Step 5:** Bake in the preheated oven, covered, for 15 minutes. Uncover and sprinkle remaining cheese on top. Bake, uncovered, 10 minutes more.
- Step 6:** Turn on the oven's broiler and set a rack 6 inches from the heat source. Broil casserole until cheese is browned, about 2 minutes. Remove from the oven and serve.

7 SURPRISING REASONS TO WEAR SUNGLASSES

Just as it can damage your skin, the sun can do a number on your eyes. Among other things, ultraviolet (UV) rays can increase your chances of contracting debilitating conditions like cataracts and even cancer.

“I can honestly tell when somebody was born and raised in Florida [and] when they weren’t,” says Kimberly Caracci, an optometrist at the Cleveland Clinic Florida. She explains that she can tell apart her patients who spent years in the Florida sun just by the damage it did to their eyes.

Still, no need to stay inside to avoid the sun’s harmful rays. Sunglasses are an efficient — and stylish — way to protect your peepers, as long as they provide 100 percent UVA and UVB protection. Here are 7 good reasons to wear them:

1. Not protecting your eyes on a sunny day could lead to eyestrain and headaches.

You may have experienced this on a particularly bright day. “If I don’t wear sunglasses, and you tell me to drive for an hour in sunny conditions, I will certainly have a headache,” says Alister Gibbons, M.D., an ophthalmologist at the Bascom Palmer Eye Institute and an associate professor at the University of Miami. Squinting

because of the light could fatigue your eyes, which might in turn lead to eyestrain and headaches.

2. You can get skin cancer on your eyelids, too.

The skin on your eyelids is the thinnest on your body, but it’s hard to protect it against the sun’s harmful rays. Putting sunscreen on your eyelids can lead to irritation or styes, Caracci says, which makes sunglasses a must. Protecting your eyelids with sunglasses could also slow your skin’s aging process and limit the formation of wrinkles.

3. The sun can cause small growths on your eyes.

These small bumps, called pingueculae and pterygia, grow on the conjunctiva, which covers the white part of your eyes. The more you expose your eyes to the sun, the more likely you are to get one of these bumps. Wind and dust are also believed to cause their formation.

While a pinguecula may contain deposits of protein, fat or calcium, the American Academy of Ophthalmology explains, a pterygium (also known as surfer’s eye) is a growth of fleshy tissue that may start as a pinguecula.

“If [a pterygium] grows close enough to the center of the cornea, it will very much drop your

vision,” says Peter J. McDonnell, M.D., director of the Wilmer Eye Institute and a professor of ophthalmology at the Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine.

4. Your eyes, too, can get sunburnt.

This condition is called photokeratitis. “It’s actually very common [...] to see people that went skiing without any sort of eye protection literally burning their corneas,” Gibbons says. That specific condition is referred to as snow blindness, but your eyes can also get sunburnt at the beach from the sun’s reflection on the sand and water. “Fortunately, it’s temporary, and it usually doesn’t leave any lasting damage. But it can be extremely painful,” Gibbons says.

5. Sun exposure over time can increase your risk of developing cataracts.

Everyone would get cataracts — a condition in which the eye’s lens becomes cloudy — if they lived long enough, McDonnell explains. But spending too much time in the sun could lead to an earlier onset of the disease. The World Health Organization estimates that up to 10 percent of cataracts may be caused by overexposure to UV light and could be avoided.

6. You can get melanoma in your eyes.

Skin isn’t the only area of your body where you can get

a dangerous cancer called melanoma. The choroid — the layer located between the white of the eye and the retina — contains a lot of melanocytes, the cells that produce and contain melanin. “They can start multiplying and cause very aggressive cancers that can make you lose [not only] your eye, your vision, but even your life,” Gibbons says. Ocular melanoma can also appear in the iris or ciliary body — sometimes even on the conjunctiva.

People with light skin and eyes, as well as those over 50, are at higher risk, but the condition remains very rare. Specialists still don’t know exactly what causes eye melanoma, but sun exposure may contribute to the development of the disease.

7. Sunglasses are not bad for your health.

Gibbons says the myth that sunglasses can be harmful might have originated at a time when sunglasses didn’t offer 100 percent UVA and UVB protection. “Patients [would] wear the sunglasses, and their pupils would become a little bigger because it was less light coming in,” he says. “So, if your pupils are a little bit bigger, but you’re not blocking the UV light, you will get more [harmful light] into your eye.” But this won’t be an issue with most sunglasses today, he says, because nearly all sunglasses offer UVA and UVB protection.

SHOULD THIS GO IN THE FRIDGE OR PANTRY?

Many of us have grappled with a classic dilemma: Should this food stay on the counter or go in the refrigerator? It’s a question that often sparks heated debates among family members.

To settle at least some of these disputes and help keep your food safe from harmful germs while maintaining its quality, we spoke with Nicole Arnold, an assistant professor and food safety field specialist at the Ohio State University.

Refrigerating food not only preserves product quality, including flavor, color, texture and shelf life, Arnold says. It also helps slow the growth of spoilage and harmful microorganisms by keeping food cool.

When deciding whether something should be refrigerated, you should always check the manufacturer’s instructions on the label. Recipes and processing can vary even among similar products.

Here are 12 foods you might want to refrigerate or freeze after opening or buying them. The next time someone suggests leaving something out, you’ll know what to do.

1. Butter

Salted butter has a longer shelf life than unsalted because of the preservative effect of salt. And since butter is high in fat, it doesn’t spoil as quickly as other dairy products, says Julie Kramer, a registered dietitian at Northwell Health in New York.

Kramer says salted butter may be safely kept on the counter for a day or two, provided your kitchen stays below 70 degrees Fahrenheit. Unsalted butter, on the other hand, should stay in the fridge and shouldn’t be left out for more than 30 to 60 minutes.

U.S. Department of Agriculture recommendations: Butter can be left at room temperature for one to two days, stored in the refrigerator for one to two months and frozen for up to six to nine months for extended freshness.

Industry advice: The National Dairy Council advises refrigerating unsalted and whipped butter. If your kitchen temperature rises above 70 degrees F, all butter should be moved to the refrigerator or the freezer for longer storage. For those who enjoy soft, spreadable butter, stick with salted and leave it out no more than a day or two. When in doubt, don’t leave it out.

2. Opened Canned Goods

Refrigerating opened canned goods depends largely on the type of food they contain. For instance, Arnold says that opened canned meats and fish should always be refrigerated after opening, whereas opened canned fruit may remain safe at room temperature for short periods.

Although it’s safe to store food in the can, it retains its flavor better when transferred to a glass or plastic container.

USDA recommendations: High-acid foods like tomato products, juice, fruit, pickles, sauerkraut and other items in vinegar-based sauces can be refrigerated for five to seven days after opening and in the pantry for up to 18 months, if sealed. Canned foods with low acid content, like meat, poultry, fish, gravy, stew, soups, beans, carrots, corn, pasta, peas, potatoes and spinach, can be refrigerated for three to four days after opening. They can also be stored in the pantry for up to five years.

Industry advice: Del Monte says its canned foods can last about two to three years from the day they were made, as long as the can isn’t broken. After that time, color, flavor and texture deteriorate, but the product should remain safe to eat.

Regardless of their age, the company recommends throwing out any swollen or leaking containers.

Otherwise, canned food should be stored in a sealed glass or plastic container in the refrigerator for two to three days.

3. Eggs

In the United States, eggs are washed to remove dirt and surface bacteria. However, that process also strips away a natural protective coating called the cuticle, leaving the shell more porous. Therefore, refrigeration is necessary to prevent bacteria from getting inside.

In many European countries, eggs aren’t washed, so the cuticle remains intact. That means the shells may have some contamination, either from the egg’s formation inside the hen or from contact with droppings after being laid. But the inside of the egg is better protected and doesn’t need to be refrigerated.

USDA recommendations: Raw eggs in their shells can be safely stored in the refrigerator for three to five weeks. Once refrigerated, they must remain cold. Leaving them out at room temperature for more than two hours can cause sweating, which allows bacteria to enter the egg and multiply. Hard-boiled eggs can be stored in the fridge for up to one week.

For best results, the USDA advises keeping eggs in their original carton and placing them in the coldest part of the fridge at 40 degrees or below.

While the “sell-by” date on the carton may pass, eggs are often still safe to eat within the storage window.

Industry advice: From the moment an egg is laid, natural physical and chemical changes begin to affect its freshness and quality. Warm temperatures speed up this process, which is why eggs should be collected and refrigerated promptly, according to the American Egg Board.

Refrigerated raw eggs maintain quality for about four to five weeks beyond the pack date (printed as the Julian date on the carton), or roughly three weeks after purchase.

Store-bought egg whites should always be refrigerated, says Eggland’s Best.

4. Flour

Exposure to air causes the oil in flour to degrade over time and develop a rancid smell, especially whole wheat flour because it has a high oil content, says Nicola McKeown, a Director of the Nutritional Epidemiology Program at Tufts University’s Friedman School of Nutrition Science and Policy.

USDA recommendations: White flour can stay fresh in the pantry for six to 12 months after purchase and up to a year in the refrigerator once opened. Whole wheat flour has a shorter shelf life — about three to six months in the pantry and six to eight months in the fridge after opening.

Industry advice: Pillsbury suggests storing its flour in an airtight container at 75 degrees F or cooler. To keep flour fresh for up to two years, store it in a resealable freezer bag and freeze.

5. Hot Sauce

USDA recommendations: For best quality, hot sauce should be consumed within six months of being stored in the pantry. However, it’ll stay fresher longer in the refrigerator.

Industry advice: Frank’s RedHot says the date stamped on its bottles is the time recommended for finishing the product for optimum flavor. However, it will “generally maintain” good flavor a few weeks afterward. Refrigeration helps with quality but isn’t necessary. The recommended shelf life for an unopened bottle is 24 months from the date of production.

6. Jams and Jellies

USDA recommendations: Refrigerate store-bought jams and jellies after opening for six to 12 months and up to 18 months in the pantry when sealed.

Doing so maintains quality while preventing mold and yeast growth, Arnold says. If you choose to store jams and jellies at room temperature, keep them in a cool, dark place. Know that low-sugar options are likely to deteriorate faster because sugar acts as a natural preservative, Arnold adds.

Industry advice: Smucker’s recommends refrigerating its spreads “for maximum freshness and flavor” and advises against using unopened products that have been without refrigeration for more than 48 hours.

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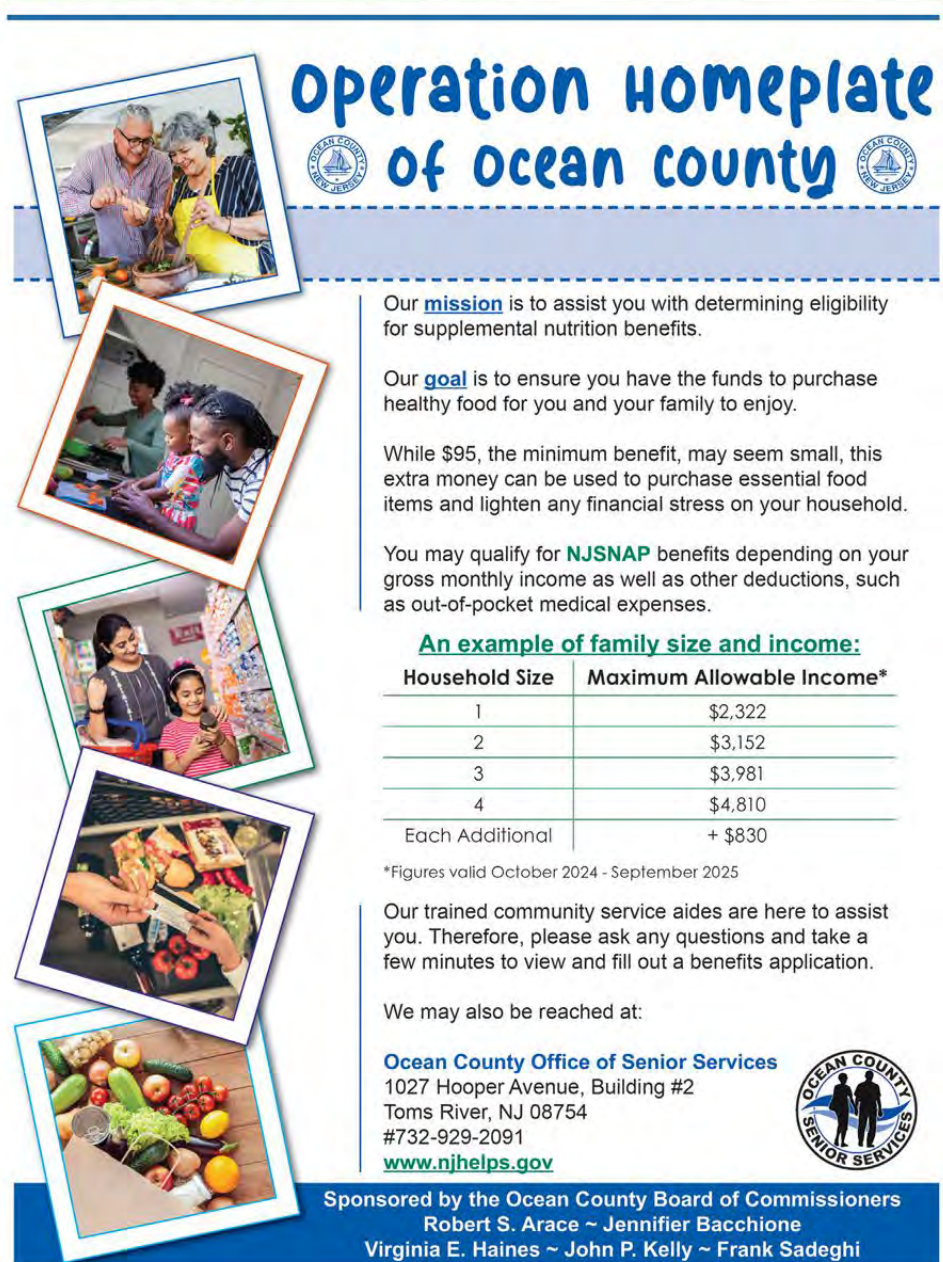

BIG CHANGES TO NJ ANCHOR TAX REBATE HAVE STARTED: WHAT TO KNOW

Millions of New Jersey residents can now find out if they're enrolled to receive a major property tax relief program from the state this year.

The New Jersey Division of Taxation says it began sending out confirmation letters to residents that meet the requirements for the 2025 Affordable New Jersey Communities for Homeowners and Renters (ANCHOR) relief program. These notifications go out to anyone under the age of 65 who is not collecting Social Security benefits. While the state will auto-file for most eligible residents, you are also able to file your own application beginning this month by visiting the ANCHOR program website.

Benefits under ANCHOR are also available to senior citizens and others who receive Social Security benefits. This year, a new form allows these groups to apply to multiple tax relief programs at once. The new PAS-1 application allows these groups to apply for ANCHOR, Senior Freeze, and the upcoming Stay NJ program with one form.

How Much To Expect, And When

The first payments will begin to go out on Sept. 15 on a rolling basis, usually within 90 days of filing. Those who file by paper will only be able to receive their funds by paper check. Online filers will have the option to receive a check or to use direct deposit. Benefit amounts available are a maximum of \$1,750

for senior homeowners, and \$700 for senior renters, depending on income. Those under 65 are eligible to receive up to \$450 for renters, and \$1,500 for homeowners.

Eligibility

Qualifying for ANCHOR is based on multiple factors across residency, income and age recorded for applicants during 2024.

Homeowners:

You were a New Jersey resident and

- You owned and occupied a home in New Jersey that was your principal residence (main home) on Oct. 1, 2024
- Your home was subject to property taxes; and
- Your 2024 New Jersey gross income was not more than \$250,000.

Renters

You were a New Jersey resident and

- You rented and occupied a residence in New Jersey that was your principal residence (main home) on Oct. 1, 2024
- Your name was on the lease or rental agreement
- You paid rent
- The rental property was subject to local property taxes (see Qualified and Non-Qualified Rental Properties)
- Your 2024 New Jersey gross income was not more than \$150,000.

After Receiving Your Letter

Anyone receiving a letter of eligibility confirmation who needs to change their bank information, or would like to receive their relief via a paper check must file their own application by Sept. 15.

The state is not sending out ID information to file applications by mail anymore. You must use the ID.me site when filing online.

Applicants should have their 2024 property tax details readily available. This includes County/Municipality Code, Block/Lot/Qualifier, etc. Filers will also need their gross income reported on the 2024 NJ-1040 form.

Deadline

The filing deadline for the ANCHOR program is Oct. 31. You can check the status of your benefits by visiting the Department of the Treasury's website.

On June 30, Governor Phil Murphy signed an estimated \$4.3 billion of tax relief into his budget for the new fiscal year. This includes \$2.4 million for the continuation of ANCHOR. *patch.com*

7. Ketchup

Condiments should be stored in the refrigerator door, while perishables should be kept on the inner shelves. The door is ideal for condiments, which are less temperature-sensitive, while a colder interior helps keep perishable items fresher longer.

USDA recommendations: To keep ketchup fresh, including cocktail and chili sauces, you can store them in the pantry for one year if you don't open them. Then you can store them in the refrigerator for six months after opening. However, ketchup and its tomato-based cousins, like cocktail and chili sauce, are still safe to eat even when they are left out at room temperature.

Industry advice: Heinz says refrigerate after opening "for best results."

8. Maple syrup

USDA recommendations: Unopened maple syrup sold in glass will remain fresh in the pantry for four years from the date of purchase and indefinitely in the refrigerator. If it's sold in plastic, it should last two years in the pantry and up to 24 months refrigerated.

Industry advice: Hungry Jack says it doesn't recommend using its syrups past the "best if used by" date. However, the company doesn't specify whether its advice is for quality or food safety reasons.

9. Mayonnaise

USDA recommendation: To keep mayonnaise fresh, store it in the pantry for three to six months after you buy it. Store it in the fridge for two months after you open it.

Industry advice: For the best flavor and quality, Hellmann's tells its customers to reference the "best if used by" date and store mayonnaise in the refrigerator door after opening. Don't freeze or place it in the back of the fridge because colder

temperatures may cause the product to separate.

10. Peanut butter

USDA recommendations: Peanut butter jars that have not been opened can stay in the pantry for six to 24 months. After opening, they can stay in the pantry for up to three months.

Alternatively, natural peanut butter should be kept in the refrigerator and eaten within 12 months if sealed or three to four months after opening. That's because natural peanut butter can spoil faster at room temperature, Arnold says. Its oils are more prone to mold and separation, leading to quality issues.

Industry advice: Jif says its traditional peanut butter doesn't require refrigeration and should be stored in a cool, dry place for up to two years when unopened and about three months in the pantry after opening.

Meanwhile, its natural peanut butters should maintain freshness while unopened for about a year in the pantry.

11. Salad dressing

USDA recommendations: Unopened salad dressing can stay fresh in the pantry for up to six months from the date of purchase, whether creamy or vinaigrette. Once opened, creamy dressings, like ranch, should be used within three to four weeks, and vinaigrettes within about four weeks, for best quality. Both types should be refrigerated after opening. If the dressing was sold in the refrigerated section at the store, it likely needs to stay refrigerated at home, even if unopened. Always check the label for storage instructions.

Industry advice: Hidden Valley Ranch says its ranch dressing will last for one to two months refrigerated after opening. To reduce the risk of illness, it should be thrown out if left at room temperature for more than two hours.

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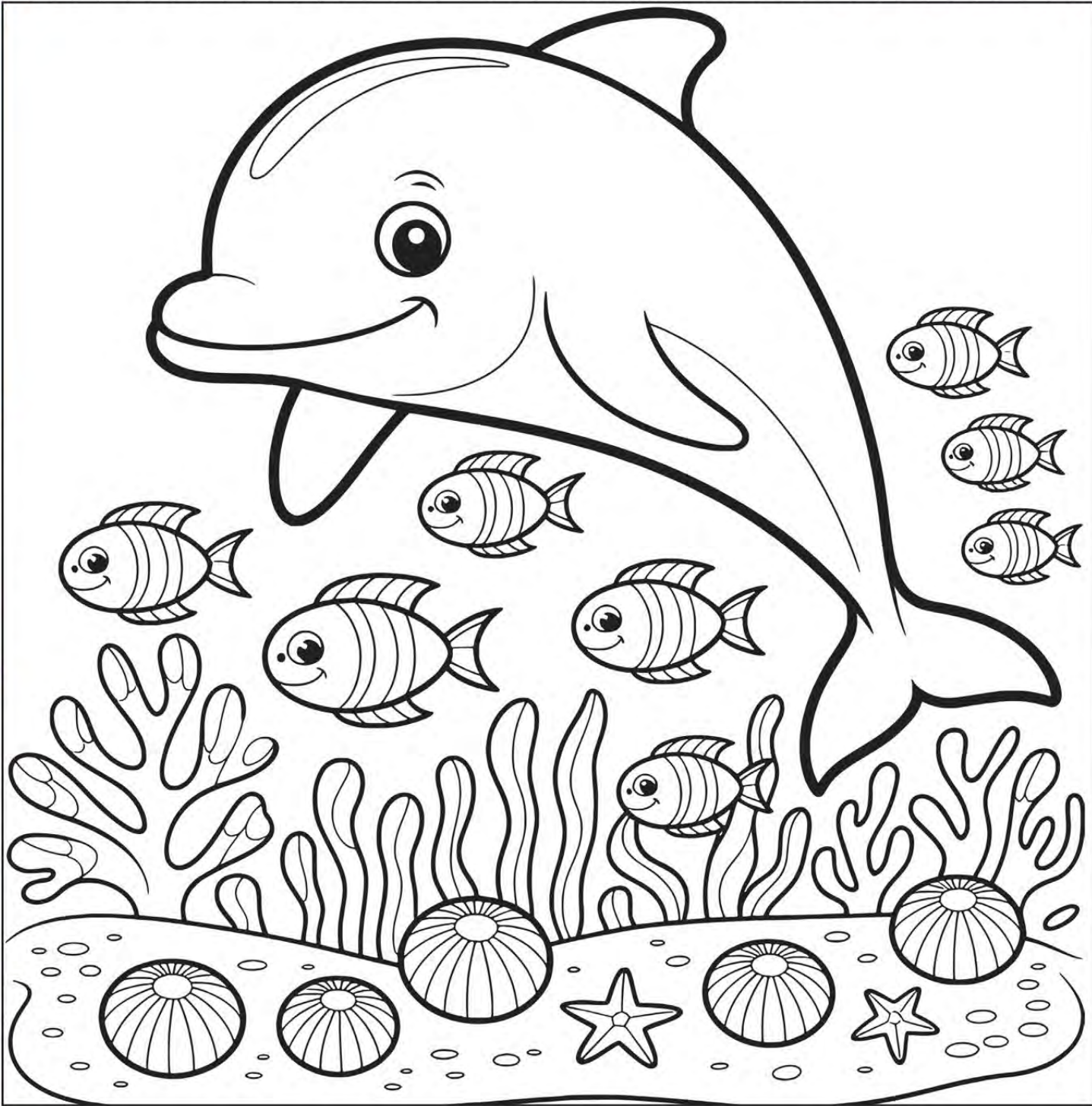

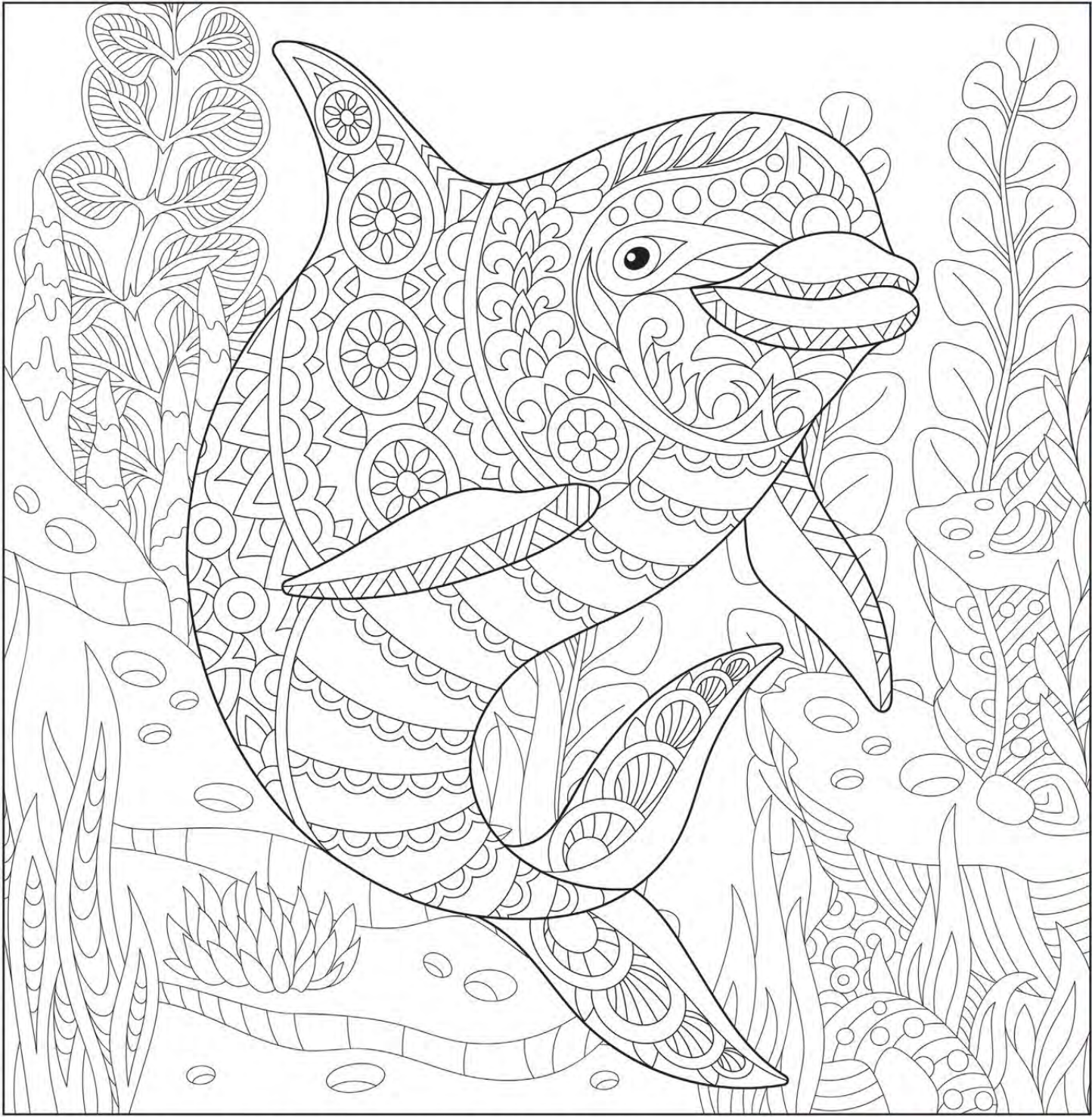
