BRICK, N.J. - Aug. 21, 2025 - PRLog Ocean Partnership for Children (OPC) is proud to celebrate 20 years of providing care management services to youth and families in Ocean County. As part of this milestone year, OPC is expanding its reach into local schools through the DREAMS Initiative, funded by the New Jersey Department of Children and Families (DCF)'s Children's System of Care (CSOC).

Beginning this fall, OPC's certified Nurtured Heart Approach® (NHA) Trainers will provide coaching, mentoring, and training to students, faculty, and staff at Silver Bay Elementary, West Dover Elementary, Plumsted's PreK program, and Central Regional High School.

The program will be overseen by Danielle Galgon, OPC Training Coordinator and Advanced Certified NHA Trainer, who emphasized the importance of the initiative: "The goal is to help identify gaps for students and develop strong relationships with the schools to foster sustainable strategies within their environments," Galgon said. "Some of these strategies may include NHA-focused counseling groups, calming areas, and reset stations for both students and staff."

The Nurtured Heart Approach®, which focuses on building positive connections through intense emotions and reinforcing inner wealth and strength, is a powerful tool to help schools cultivate supportive and empowering environments for children



SURF CITY - In one amazing two-year burst of inspiration, Giuseppe Verdi composed three of the world's most beloved operas that set a new path for the art form and secured his place in the opera pantheon. Maestro



Robert Butts will discuss "Verdi's Trilogy: Il Trovatore, Rigoletto and La Traviata," 2 p.m. Wednesday, October 8 at the Ocean County Library Long Beach Island Branch. Maestro Butts will discuss the importance of these masterpieces to Verdi's career and to the international

opera world. The discussion of these pivotal works is a worthy introduction to the worldwide 2026 celebrations of Verdi's life and career. Debuting between 1851 and 1853, Verdi's works quickly

became audience favorites for their individual feelings, settings, characterizations, and aesthetics. To this day, their popularity remains as strong as it was 170 years ago.

Il Trovatore is rooted in the bel canto traditions popularized by Bellini and Donizetti. Rigoletto captures the romantic fervor of the 19th century. La Traviata is an early example of the growing trend towards realism. Maestro Butts has conducted Il Trovatore in Constanta, Romania and he conducted Rigoletto and La Traviata here in New Jersey, in concert and staged productions.



7 SALT SUBSTITUTES AND HOW TO USE THEM

A dash of table salt to liven up a bland dish here and there may not seem like a big deal, but you're probably getting more salt than you think. While the Dietary Guidelines for Americans recommends no more than 2,300 milligrams (mg) of sodium per day, most Americans are getting 3,400 mg a day on

"Salt adds flavor to food, but eating too much of it can lead to some health issues," says Laura M. Ali, a culinary nutritionist in Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. Research shows that a high-salt diet is linked to an increased risk of high blood pressure (hypertension), which raises your risk of heart disease and

More and more people are turning to salt alternatives to improve their health without sacrificing taste. One 2024 study of adults ages 55 and older with normal blood pressure found those who replaced salt with a substitute were 40 percent less likely to develop hypertension over two years than those who kept using salt.

If you love the taste of salt and aren't ready to kick it to the curb, try a low-sodium or sodium-free salt substitute like Nu-Salt, Morton Salt Substitute, McCormick's NoSalt Original Sodium-Free Salt, or one of the Dash blends (formerly Mrs. Dash). Whereas table salt is made of sodium chloride, salt substitutes are products made entirely or partly of potassium chloride.

"Potassium chloride salt substitutes can be a helpful choice for cutting down on sodium while boosting potassium intake both of which can support healthier blood pressure in people with hypertension."

6. Black Pepper

There's a reason black pepper is the companion of table salt. "Black pepper contains a chemical called capsaicin that causes a mild irritation and makes your taste buds a bit more sensitive to salty flavors," Ali says. Adding a sprinkle of black pepper to your food can help you cut back or even nix table salt entirely.

As a bonus, black pepper is a versatile spice that can enhance almost any food with its mild, spicy flavor, Ali says.

She suggests seasoning meat or poultry with black pepper before cooking to help infuse the dish with flavor during cooking. Black pepper is also a great choice for adding a bit of a kick to steamed vegetables after cooking and boosts the flavor of sauces, salad dressings, soups, and stews, Ali

7. Fresh Garlic

This root vegetable offers a pungent, spicy flavor when raw but transitions into sweet, buttery when cooked. Thanks to its strong presence, garlic can boost the flavor of many dishes without the help of table salt.

"Fresh garlic can be used in many different ways, from sautéing to roasting, and adds a ton of flavor," Prest notes. Incorporate garlic into sauces, soups, and stews, or add to pizza, pasta, steak, and potatoes.

8 FOODS TO PROTECT YOUR MUSCLES AS YOU AGE

Muscle mass and strength naturally decline with age, but there are things you can do to protect and maintain your muscles.

How to thwart muscle loss

Scientists believe that exercise and diet are most effective in combating the effects of muscle loss and, in some cases, reversing it. In general, consuming more protein and vitamin D — along with physical activity — is the most researched solution for optimal muscle health.

Mediterranean and Japanese diets may offer protection from muscle loss because they're low in fat while being high in vegetables, fruits and high-quality protein. A typical Western diet —high in processed foods, refined grains, red and processed meats and high-sugar drinks — is linked to increased muscle loss with age, according to a 2022 report.

The power of protein

The most important factor for maintaining muscle health as you age is getting ample protein, because you build less muscle and break down protein more. "This is important, as muscle is a major metabolic organ as well,' Batsis says.

The recommended daily allowance (RDA) of protein is 0.8 grams per kilogram of weight. Some research suggests older people need 1 to 1.2 grams per kilogram of weight — that's anywhere from 75 to 90 grams per day for a 165-pound person.

High-quality protein is a must for maintaining muscle, so make sure you're getting about 20 to 35 grams of protein in every meal. Another breakdown advises adults over 65 to get 1 to 1.2 grams of protein per day for every 2 pounds they weigh. Amino acids — especially one called leucine — are just as vital to preserve muscles. Aim for approximately 2.5 to 2.8 grams of leucine per day.

Vitamin D for muscle health

Your body produces less vitamin D as you age, so getting enough is critical for healthy muscles, Batsis says. Evidence shows that vitamin D deficiency, specifically, contributes to muscle loss. Ask your doctor to check your vitamin D levels to see if you need a supplement, Fielding says.

Top foods for muscle health

When it comes to eating for muscle health, these foods are some of the best bets.

1. Cow's milk

A glass of milk or a whey protein smoothie can be a simple way to get your protein fix. Whey is a protein found in cow's milk that's commonly extracted into protein powders. Some research shows that whey, leucine and vitamin D improved 5. Wild salmon scores in tests used to assess muscle mass.

Note: If cow's milk isn't an option, fortified soy alternatives could be a good choice, as they contain added calcium, vitamin A and vitamin D. These dairy foods are also good sources of protein, Fielding notes.

Serving size: 3.5 ounces, whole milk

Protein: 3.5 grams

2. Chicken

This poultry is a protein powerhouse. The proteins in meats and seafood in general are

especially good for us because they have an amino acid profile very similar to that for the proteins in our bodies, Fielding says.

Note: Not in the mood for chicken but still want a good source of protein? Opt for loin cuts of beef or pork, lean ground beef or turkey, says Elizabeth Dennis, an associate professor in physical therapy and rehabilitation at the University of Maryland School of Medicine.

Serving size: 3.5 ounces (about the palm of your hand), boneless and skinless.

Protein: 32 grams

If you don't eat animal-based proteins, make sure you're getting a well-rounded blend of amino acids from other protein sources, Fielding says. Tofu, a soy-based product, fits the bill. And even if you do eat meat, tofu can be nice to add into the

Note: Don't forget about grains, nuts and seeds as protein sources, says Jennifer Bruning, a registered dietitian nutritionist and Academy of Nutrition and Dietetics spokesperson.

Serving size: ½ cup

Protein: 21.8 grams

Peas and lentils contain protein, but they aren't complete proteins — foods that contain the nine amino acids that our bodies don't make. That said, they still pack a protein punch (with the fiber content to boot).

Note: Quinoa, hemp seeds, chia seeds and spirulina are complete proteins, so balancing these with beans can give you a more wideranging amino acid profile.

Serving size: ½ cup black beans

Protein: 7.6 grams

In addition to being a great source of protein, wild salmon is high in vitamin D. Think farmed salmon is the same? Not quite, as it has about 25 percent of the vitamin D as wild salmon, according to one report. Data varies on levels between farmed and wild salmon, but wild salmon typically has more vitamin D. Both types are good sources of the vitamin.

Note: Trout and tuna are other solid seafood sources for vitamin D and protein.

Serving size: 3.5 ounces of wild salmon (about the size of your palm)

Vitamin D: 988 international units (IUs) Protein: 25 grams (in a 3-ounce serving)

Eggs are a good source of protein despite the ongoing debate over them. And don't ditch those egg yolks — they're some of the best food sources for vitamin D, Dennis says.

Note: Other fortified foods, like orange juice, have good amounts of vitamin D — just check the label to confirm the vitamin has been added, Dennis says.

Serving size: 1 large egg

Vitamin D: 44 IUs

Protein: 6 grams

7. Sweet potato

Sweet potatoes aren't exactly a protein powerhouse, but they're loaded with betacarotene, an antioxidant known as carotenoid. Research finds that vegetable and fruit intake may support muscle health in older people. One study found that adults between 65 and 85 who ate more fruits and vegetables had stronger grip strength — one sign of muscle health — compared with those who ate fewer amounts of the plants.

Note: Some research indicates that highalkaline diets full of fruits and veggies can lower acidity in your body and protect muscle health, Fielding says. Cruciferous vegetables - broccoli, cauliflower, cabbage, kale, Brussels sprouts — show some promise in protecting muscle as we age, he adds.

Serving size: 1 cup, baked and no salt Beta-carotene: 23,018 micrograms

8. Red bell pepper

Veggies with the red and orange hues are rich in beta-carotene — and the red pepper is one that Fielding recommends for your muscles. Scientists have documented some muscle benefits linked to carotenoid intake, and other research has linked low carotenoid levels to reduced muscle content in older adults. More studies are needed to better understand how carotenoids can affect muscles, Fielding says.

Note: Carrots have a high carotenoid content, but tomatoes can also be a good source, Fielding says.

Serving size: ½ cup

Beta-carotene: 1,210 micrograms





HERE'S WHAT HAPPENS IF YOU DON'T STOP FOR **AN NJ SCHOOL BUS**

Back-to-school season is upon us, and with that, we're going to see some changes to routines and schedules.

Drivers Need To Watch For School Buses In New Jersey

We'll also see some changes on the roads; school buses will again be a part of the daily commute, and you're going to want to be extra careful that you don't break any laws when it comes to interacting with a school bus while on the road.

NJ School Bus Safety Laws Carry **Heavy Penalties**

Something as small as not stopping with enough space between you and a school bus with flashing red lights can lead to major fines, points on your license, and, in severe cases, jail time.

Being aware of school bus safety while driving around Jersey is incredibly important; those buses are transporting people's children, and we want to keep them safe.

Why I always Stop For School Buses

Personally, even if I come up to a school bus that's just slowing down and putting on its yellow flashing lights, I'll stop. Honk at me all you want, I'm not getting a ticket.

What Happens If You Pass A School Bus Illegally In NJ?

So, what happens if you don't stop for a school bus with its red lights on and its stop sign out?

According to NJ.gov, there are several things that could happen.

For a first offense, it's a fine of no less than \$100, and up to 15 days in jail or 15 days of community service. For a second offense, the fine increases to no less than \$250, and you could face 15 days of jail time. Each offense also comes with 5 points on your license.

And if you're unsure of when you're supposed to stop for a school bus, it's anytime you see red flashing lights and a stop sign displayed. You want to make sure you also stop at least 25 feet from the spot where the bus stops to pick up children.

Exceptions To New Jersey's School Bus Safety Laws

There are, however, a few exceptions to when you have to stop for a school bus.

They're few and far between, but when you're on a divided highway, and a bus is stopped with its flashing red lights, and a stop sign is out, you may proceed at a speed of no more than 10 miles per hour. You may also pass a bus with its flashing red lights when it's parked directly in front of a school zone, again at a speed of no more than 10 miles per

Most buses have cameras on the outside now to catch people who violate school bus passing laws, so when in doubt, don't pass the bus.



JERSEY SHORE LANDMARK WASHED AWAY BY HURRICANE ERIN

The mast of a shipwreck buried in the sand of Barnegat Light is now gone after Hurricane Erin's waves beat Long Beach Island.

BARNEGAT LIGHT. NJ - A longstanding landmark buried in the sands of Long Beach Island has washed away due to Hurricane Erin.

The steel mast on the beach, the only remnants of the fishing boat Sea King, is gone, according to social media reports.

It's sat there

since 1963, when the Sea King was towing the decommissioned minesweeper Prescott to Atlantic City. Both ships were stranded on the Barnegat Shoals and while the Prescott was salvaged, the Sea King was buried in the sand, according to the New Jersey Maritime Museum in Beach Haven.

Since then, the tall mast sticking out of the ground has been used as a landmark and as a spot to take photos.

The loss of the landmark was met with sadness from social media users, many sharing photos and videos in its memory.

Some likened it to the loss of "The Shack," an old, derelict building that was served as a well-known welcome sign in the marshes of Cedar Bonnet Island until its demise when Superstorm Sandy struck in 2012.




