CAUSEWAY CARES LAUNCHES HOLIDAY FOOD DRIVE FOR FULFILL NJ

SNAP Benefits Crisis Triggers Immediate Need for Community Action



The holiday season is about giving back, especially as many local families face new challenges brought on by the SNAP benefits crisis. This year, Causeway CARes is once again inviting the community to step up and help fight hunger through its annual Holiday Food Drive benefiting Fulfill NJ, our local food bank

serving Monmouth and Ocean Counties.

Starting November 12th, all Causeway Family of Dealerships showrooms will begin collecting non-perishable food items to support neighbors who are struggling to put meals on the table.

For more than 40 years, Fulfill NJ — formerly known as The FoodBank of Monmouth and Ocean Counties — has been dedicated to ending hunger and building hope. The organization distributes over 13 million meals each year through a network of pantries and community partners, providing vital food and resources to families, seniors, and individuals facing food

"We're proud to support Fulfill once again," said Joe Stroffolino, Director of Advertising and Marketing for Causeway Family of Dealerships and Vice-Chair of Fulfill's Board of Trustees. "Their impact is felt right here in our community, and this time of year, every donation truly makes a difference."

Fulfill President and CEO Triada Stampas recently underscored the urgency of the situation: "We estimate about 4.3 million meals that SNAP households will not be able to purchase until their benefits arrive. That means Fulfill would need to more than triple our normal distribution to fill that gap."

[Update:] Since that statement, there has been a glimmer of relief for many local families. "On Friday, November 7th, thanks to the action of our state in response to a federal court order, full SNAP benefits have been issued for November, and 90,000 of our Monmouth and Ocean County neighbors have gotten some breathing room at last. Tonight, they can finally stock their fridges and pantries," Stampas shared.

Most Needed Food Items:

- Pop-top canned vegetables (low-sodium)
- Pop-top canned fruit (in 100% juice)
- Pop-top canned soup and meals
- Pop-top canned meat
- Instant or shelf-stable cooked
- rice or pasta
- Shelf-stable microwaveable meals
- Shelf-stable 100% juice (8oz containers preferred)
- Shelf-stable milk (8oz containers preferred)
- Crackers
- Cereal or cereal bars
- Oatmeal packets
- Protein bars
- Granola bars
- Trail mix
- Bottled water

However, she cautioned that the challenges are far from over:

"The harm of this federal shutdown continues. Federal employees and contractors are going unpaid. In the next two weeks, December SNAP benefits should be scheduled, but the USDA's reserve fund is now depleted. And because ensuring a steady supply of commodity foods

for food banks is not considered an essential government function, the USDA has not made a single new TEFAP order in almost six weeks — creating the risk of a major gap in our food supply."

The Causeway Holiday Food Drive runs from November 12th through December 18th, helping bridge that gap for families across the Jersey Shore.

How to Get Involved

1. Drop Off Food Donations

Bring a bag of non-perishable food items to any Causeway showroom and receive one entry into our Holiday Giveaway.

2. Purchase a Vehicle on November 28th or 29th Anyone who buys a new or pre-owned vehicle during Black Friday weekend will receive 10 Holiday Giveaway entries!

3. Multiple Prizes, Multiple Winners

Each showroom will feature its own giveaway prize, with winners announced December 19th, just in time for the holidays!



5 SURPRISING SIGNS OF AN INFECTION IN OLDER ADULTS

Feeling off but not spiking a fever? That doesn't necessarily mean you don't have the flu, COVID or other common illnesses that circulate this time of year.

Many of the early warning signs of common infections appear differently in older adults - and some of the symptoms can be surprising.

Much of it has to do with the weakening of the immune system with age, a process known as immunosenescence. This decline blunts the typical response to fighting off infection and the symptoms that result from this defense, like fever and chills. Instead, common illnesses can appear with less common symptoms.

"We see very atypical presentations for some of these respiratory viruses in older adults," says Dr. Morgan Katz, an infectious disease specialist at Johns Hopkins Medicine. This is why learning to recognize and monitor these symptoms is key.

For example, any changes in a person's appetite, personality and overall behavior are worrisome, doctors say, especially when these changes happen quickly.

"Infection is a concern when there's any rapid change in an older person. meaning overnight or within hours, something is different from how it had been before," says Dr. Nina Blachman, a geriatrician at New York University Langone. But just because someone is experiencing a symptom like confusion doesn't necessarily mean they are sick — that's why knowing a person's usual state, or baseline, and tracking changes throughout the day is so important.

Staying on top of so-called baseline metrics is also important if you have a separate and unrelated health condition, such as diabetes or heart disease, since a new infection can exacerbate an underlying issue.

Here are five surprising symptoms that could signal you're getting sick, plus tips on how to stay healthy this cold and flu season.

Unusual symptoms of an infection

1. Confusion

Any new or worsening confusion could be a warning sign of an infection, says Katz. A small study

published in the journal Clinical Nursing Research found that infection and dehydration were the leading causes of short-term confusion among residents in a long-term care facility.

Delirium, a more intense type of confusion, can also be a symptom of infection. "Often, it's a very concerning sign of a more severe infection," says Dr. Camille Vaughan, division director of geriatrics at the Emory University School of Medicine. Still, she says, experts "don't know all of the pathways that lead to those changes in brain function that lead to that confusion state."

In a study published in the British Journal of General Practice, researchers interviewed 22 patients and six caretakers and identified a "spectrum" of confusion resulting from infection. Patients described the time of their illness as a "blur," and others reported feeling muddled or out of control.

2. Falling

Falls can result from a variety of causes, ranging from medications to changes in vision to underlying health conditions. An infection can also increase a person's risk of falling especially when the body is weak or fatigued from fighting off an illness.

"I don't want to imply every time you have a fall, you need to be thinking about an infection," says Vaughan. "It could be something where we just want to be a little more tunedin that day or so afterward, to see if something may be brewing or worsening."

3. Changes in appetite

Another unusual sign of a respiratory infection is a change in appetite.

"If you see a patient looking different from their baseline in any way and that can be as simple as refusing breakfast when they typically eat breakfast — that's when you really start monitoring that patient more frequently," Katz says.

A 2023 study in Clinical Nutrition ESPEN looked at almost 2,000 participants with reported COVID-19 or other possible infections. It found adults over age 75 reported a lack of appetite more often than those under 35 did. Early detection and management of COVID-19 based on appetite loss could reduce the risk of

further complications after infection. the researchers wrote.

4. Fatigue or new weakness

The Clinical Nutrition ESPEN study also found that older adults reported fatigue more than younger age groups did. Similarly, the researchers suggest catching the symptom early on and detecting and treating the illness and could reduce the risk of future complications.

Fatigue is a common symptom of illness in all ages. "[It] may manifest as new weakness or delirium, which again, is different than our younger counterparts, often because older adults may not be able to describe their symptoms like younger adults could," Katz says.

New weakness or any deviations from normal "should be a clue that they potentially have an infection," Blachman adds.

5. A mild fever

"You can't wait for that fever because it may not actually happen,' Blachman says, "but the patient may be very sick." That's because when the immune system weakens, fevers don't rise as high.

Katz says tracking a person's temperature can help determine if an

older individual is sick. Temperatures 2 degrees Fahrenheit above a person's normal temperature should be considered a fever.

"It wouldn't be our typical 100.4 degrees Fahrenheit cutoff that we see in younger individuals," Katz adds.

Preventing and treating infections

Sometimes, getting sick is inevitable. But during respiratory illness season, it's crucial to take care of your body so you're strong enough to fight off whatever comes your way.

"Vaccines are by far the best thing to do," says Vaughan. "I want to continue to make sure that people, especially in our 65-and-older group, are getting those routine vaccines this fall."

This year's COVID-19 booster is available to most individuals after a brief discussion with a health care provider, such as a doctor or pharmacist, and many doctors say it's especially important for older adults who are more likely to experience complications from COVID. Older adults should also get a high-dose flu shot, and an RSV vaccine is recommended for people 75 and older and for some people ages 50 to

"Other things to think about are just getting enough sleep, staying hydrated, eating a healthy diet and exercising. All of those things can keep people well," Blachman says.

If you do find yourself with some atypical infection symptoms, Katz recommends checking your temperature and pulse oximetry (the levels of oxygen in the blood) roughly every two hours to gauge whether your body is going in the wrong direction.

Testing to see what's causing your symptoms, either at home or at the doctor's office, is important too, since there are antiviral treatments for illnesses like flu and COVID, and they work better the sooner you start aarp.com

IS ONE TYPE OF SUGAR HEALTHIER THAN ANOTHER?

"A little bit of sugar is like sunshine," says Carolyn O'Neil, a registered dietitian- nutritionist. We all need it, but not too much.

Naturally occurring sugars in fruits, vegetables, dairy products and grains provide essential energy for the body. The sugars are accompanied by antioxidants, fiber, protein and other nutrients. But added sugars in processed food and drinks — like cookies, cakes, sodas and sauces are linked to a variety of health and dental problems in people over age

Too much can increase the risk of dementia, heart disease, stroke, type 2 diabetes and more. Studies also show that increased consumption of added sugar is associated with an increased risk of certain cancers.

The World Health Organization recommends that adults reduce their added sugar intake to less than 10 percent of their daily calorie consumption. That means consuming fewer than 200 calories, or 50 grams, of added sugar in the average 2,000-calorie diet. The average American has about 270 calories, or 67.5 grams' worth of sugar (about 17 teaspoons), every day.

Sugar in the body

"Focus less on which sugar is the best but on choosing the smallest amount needed," says Lena Beal, a cardiovascular dietitian at Piedmont Atlanta Hospital. Sugars are made from different ratios of molecules called simple sugars, like fructose and glucose. For example, table sugar is composed of a 50:50 ratio of glucose and fructose to create sucrose. Highfructose corn syrup, despite its name, doesn't have significantly more fructose in its composition — the two common recipes are 42 percent fructose and 53 percent glucose, or 55 percent fructose and 42 percent

Despite the similar chemical nature of the sugars themselves, the body

still knows the difference: Foods with processed sugars, like cookies or birthday cake, will spike your blood sugar faster than foods with natural sugars, like berries or yogurt, because of the latter's additional antioxidants. nutrients, fiber and protein.

So what is the healthiest sugar? The answer is the kind in fruits, vegetables grains like quinoa, oats and brown rice, and dairy products, including milk and yogurt. After that, the answer is ... still complicated.

1. High-fructose corn syrup

High-fructose corn syrup has made headlines recently. Coca-Cola recently announced plans to switch its recipe from high-fructose corn syrup to cane sugar. Some other companies may be following suit. But the science is unclear about whether such substitutions will make a difference in older Americans' health or waistlines. "The data doesn't really suggest that either one of those is good or

cholesterol, high blood pressure and heart disease if it builds up.

2. Cane sugar and table sugar

Both cane (including raw sugar and turbinado) and table sugar are made up of sucrose, or an equal ratio of fructose and glucose. They come from the sugarcane plant and sugar beets but are processed differently —white sugar is washed, filtered and crystallized, while cane sugar is shredded, juiced and filtered clean, preserving some of its molasses and darker coloring.

Both have 16 calories and 4.2 grams of sugar in a teaspoon and are commonly used in baking and sweetening coffee or tea. While sucrose provides quick energy, it can also spike blood sugar and stress the heart.

3. Honey, maple syrup and agave

Honey, maple syrup and agave are seen as more natural sugars, but that doesn't necessarily make them healthier than other sugars.



better than the other, or healthier,' says Jennifer Temple, director of the Nutrition and Health Research Laboratory at the University of High-fructose corn syrup, commonly

found in sodas and other processed foods, is not easily detectable as a flavorful ingredient. The syrup behaves similarly to cane sugar in the body and has similar levels of fructose, despite what its name suggests. But one teaspoon carries 18 calories and 4.7 grams of sugar. Overconsumption of high-fructose corn syrup can make it harder for the body to produce insulin and control blood sugar. This syrup also increases the production of fat in the liver, which can trigger high

Honey has 5.8 grams of sugar and 21 calories in a teaspoon. "It's so sweet. you might be able to use less," says O'Neil. "But honey is not going to work in every recipe." It's most often used to sweeten tea and yogurt or to help soothe a cough or sore throat.

Honey contains vitamins and antioxidants, like calcium, potassium zinc and more, that corn syrup and table sugar lack. But, according to O'Neil, that doesn't always "make a big difference," because the serving size is so small

The same goes for maple syrup — it contains potassium and calcium, but the average serving does not have enough to make a difference in your nutrition. The sweetener has about 17 calories per teaspoon and 4 grams of

Agave is used to sweeten coffee. tea, cocktails, sauces and jams. It is made from the agave plant and breaks down into 90 percent fructose (a concentration higher than highfructose corn syrup), which can contribute to metabolic problems. But this vegan sweetener with 21 calories and 4.7 grams of sugar per teaspoon does have a lower glycemic index than table sugar (19 versus 60), which slows its absorption into the bloodstream.

4. Brown sugar

Brown sugar has similar properties to cane and table sugar because of its composition: mostly sucrose, with a little molasses to give it a darker color. While molasses contains iron and

other minerals, this is still not enough to make brown sugar nutritious. It has 17 calories and 4½ grams of sugar per teaspoon. Although it's not a healthier substitute.

5. The naturals: stevia, monk fruit.

More natural substitutes, including stevia, monk fruit extract and coconut sugar, have been increasing in popularity. But their chemical properties are like other sugars, so moderation is still important. Stevia is a zero-calorie sweetener

with more natural properties than other, artificial ones. The herb is 200 to 400 times sweeter than table sugar and can be a good substitute for those managing diabetes and weight, because it has zero grams of sugar per teaspoon.

Similarly, monk fruit extract is more than 100 times sweeter than table sugar and has zero calories and zero grams of sugar in a teaspoon. Early evidence suggests monk fruit is safe and may be a good option for people managing diabetes or reducing added sugar intake. Coconut sugar comes from the

flower of the coconut plant, not from coconuts. It has about 15 calories and 4 grams of sugar per teaspoon. "Coconut sugar is less refined than white sugar and contains small amounts of minerals and inulin fiber, but it's still primarily sucrose and raises blood sugar in a similar way," Beal says.

6. Artificial sweeteners

"They can help reduce calories. They can reduce blood sugar spikes They have benefits for people who are managing diabetes and weight," Beal says. "But it's not improving your overall diet quality. There's no nutritional value.'

Artificial sugars, like saccharin, sucralose and aspartame, are found in diet sodas, processed sweets and tabletop sweeteners. They have no calories but are much sweeter than regular sugar: Aspartame is 200 times more, sucralose 600 times more and

saccharin 200 to 700 times more.

"The artificial sweeteners or the noncaloric sweeteners that are used in products in the United States are all safe. They've all been extensively researched, and there's nothing harmful," says Temple. But research from animal studies has found that they can increase your brain's expectations for something sweet, which makes it harder in the future for whole foods and natural sugars to

Some research has also found a potential link between artificial sweeteners and increased risk of cancers, cardiovascular disease and disruptions to the gut microbiome if consumed in large quantities.

HOW BARNEGAT MAN NEARLY LOST \$95K IN ONLINE PHONE SCAM

Barnegat Police posted on Facebook on Tuesday about how they helped a man retrieve money he lost in a scam on Thursday, Oct. 30th.

Here's a breakdown of what happened so this scam doesn't happen to you.

Scam Began With an Online Pop-up Message

According to Barnegat Police, the man was using his home computer on Thursday, Oct. 30th, when a pop-up message appeared claiming that his device was infected with malware and telling him to call a telephone number. The Barnegat man called the number and gave the man who answered the call access to his computer.

The scammer then convinced the man that money had been mistakenly deposited into his bank account. The

scammer instructed the Barnegat man to purchase a cashier's check and send it through UPS to an address in Queens.

Hopefully, you realize that you should never let anyone you don't know have access to your computer over the phone, or in any other manner.

Police remind you that you should also never send large sums of money to anyone you don't know or fully trust.

The Barnegat Man Realizes He Was Scammed

The Barnegat man finally realized that he had been scammed four days later, on Sunday, November 2nd.

At that point, he reached out to Barnegat Police and told them he believed he had been scammed out of \$95,000. Barnegat Police contacted a US Postal inspector and a UPS area manager to help them find that check.






